




Dogs on leads welcome and there will be plenty of dog activities including a fun dog show each afternoon, dog activity zone and even dog dancing!

Director: Baz Luhrmann 159 mins




#### Le Jazz Trio

### The Map Makers Tale

Here at *Exmoor News*, we are constantly impressed by the knowledge, skills and talents to be found on our doorstep. We could not, however, have anticipated meeting someone who heads an Ordnance Survey (OS) team of 25 data scientists and researchers carrying out work of global importance, and who manages that team from a quiet culde-sac in Dulverton. But that is what OS Innovation Lead, Donna Lyndsay does - with passion, energy and enthusiasm.

OS maps have kept so many people on the right path for years, not least on Exmoor - but physical maps now form a very small part of OS output. Donna and her team use space and geospatial data (information from space and from on or near Earth's surface) to create essential new products and services. "This can be for government or the private sector, covering anything from business cases for new satellites to creating new companies," explains Donna.

Climate change, not surprisingly, is a major concern. Donna is Vice-Chair for Space 4 Climate, which brings together UK space-enabled climate expertise, and a member of the UK Space Agency Earth Observation Advisory Committee. At COP26 last year, she and British astronaut, Tim Peake, gave a joint presentation to schoolchildren. "Climate change is real; it's happening. We have to get the metrics right because our window of opportunity to take decisive action is very small," she

says. "It's complex but can be tackled, if we act now. We can all do something, especially at community level. And we can use our vote."



Donna Lyndsay

When Donna was growing up in Dulverton – her Exmoor roots go back many generations - she could never have imagined that she would one day be at the forefront of meeting the greatest challenge that faces the world. At school she enjoyed art and geography; she went on to an art foundation course at SCAT, and then a graphic design course at Richmond upon Thames College but left the course early, having realised that a career in graphic design wasn't for her. She returned to Dulverton and Jan Ross (former editor of Exmoor News), mentioned that the National Park had

a vacancy for a cartographer. It was the ideal job and became the launch pad for Donna's career in the geospatial information industry, which now spans 30 years.

That career has included senior positions at the European Space Agency, Earthsense, and 4 Earth Intelligence, as well as running her own consultancy and carving out time to gain an MSc in geographic information systems and remote sensing. Donna joined OS in 2020, having worked closely with the organisation in previous roles, and she is now actively involved in encouraging more girls and women to join this growing key industry.

Alongside her demanding professional life, Donna has an equally busy home life, shared with husband Henry, their two teenage children—lots of ferrying around—and the family pets, and her parents still live nearby.

She would love to see young people from Exmoor following in her footsteps. "My experience shows that you can go through the local education system and have a great career in a really important industry, living and working right here in Dulverton!"

## **Exmoor Young Voices - the Second Summit**

Young people are an endangered species on Exmoor. Housing is unaffordable, wages are low and with a lack of options, many young residents have no choice but to move elsewhere. As a result, the community loses key service providers, suffers from shrinking school numbers, and struggles without the vital rural knowledge and skills required to ensure Exmoor thrives for generations to come.

On 9 June 2022, Exmoor Young Voices hosted its second summit\* at the White Horse Inn, Exford. The event brought together Exmoor National Park Authority, local housing associations, and all of the major authorities that administer Exmoor. Several of Exmoor's young adults came to discuss how Exmoor can become a viable and sustainable place for young people to live and work.

The main aim of the summit was to reconvene after the two-year interruption caused by the pandemic,

and to consider helpful changes that organisations might make. The golden goal is to halt the flow of young adults away from Exmoor.

Four members of Exmoor Young addressed the Voices summit. speaking movingly about barriers to finding suitable rented accommodation, or self-building on the moor. This stimulated an in-depth discussion of problems, restraints and ideas. Representatives were asked to consider how they can 'youth proof' decision-making and deliver a tangible list of pledges and actions in September.

"We've made positive progress by hosting the summit and getting

important decision-makers and influencers together in one room, to hear the real-world struggles of our young adult population, and discuss actions that need to be taken. One of our attendees described it as fitting together pieces of a jigsaw, which is a great way to look at it. The summit has sparked further discussions, and we are looking forward to receiving pledges from each of Exmoor's authorities and housing associations in the autumn."





#### Junior Wildlife Wardens— **Bampton Launch**

The pilot Junior Wildlife Wardens scheme was launched in Bampton this July!



Laura Grant, from Plastic Free Bampton, is introducing children of school age to the wildlife in their local area and teaching them how to help and protect the natural environment.

"Children get so much joy from being in nature and understanding what they see around them; we are so lucky to be surrounded by diverse and interesting habitats. This is a great opportunity for the children to learn about the natural world," said Laura. "I hope this scheme can really help them to enjoy and help protect our local wildlife and environment, as well as inspiring others in our community to do the same."

So far, 30 children aged between five and 14 have signed up to participate in the programme. Over the next year, they will work through seasonal tasks

and activities in their wildlife warden handbooks, designed to help them learn about and help protect local wildlife in the Bampton area. The tasks range from building hedgehog houses and looking out for invasive species, to growing tree seedlings.

The junior wardens earn badges for each season when they complete a variety of tasks. There are events running for the wardens and general public, including a BioBlitz to record as many species as they can in an area of the town.

The junior wardens have already begun recording their wildlife observations using the iNaturalist app ,with the help and support of their parents and carers, and have spotted some brilliant plants and animals already!

The scheme is linked to the Mid Devon Wildlife Wardens Project, currently being piloted in Mid Devon, and run with the support of Plastic Free Bampton.



#### Inheritance Claims and the Inheritance Act 1975

A claim under the Inheritance Act is a claim against the estate of someone who has died, where the person bringing the claim has not been included in the will. Claims are generally brought by those who would have expected to inherit.

It is worth considering this if you plan to write a will excluding someone who would expect to inherit. Likewise, if you have not been provided for but you expected and needed to be, you may have a claim under the Act.

#### Who can bring a claim?

Only those listed in s1 of the Act can bring a claim. They are:

Spouse/ former spouse

A child of the deceased or a person treated as the child of the deceased.

A cohabitee who lived with the deceased as spouses / civ-

il partners for a period of at least two years prior to death

A person who was financially supported by the deceased at the time of death.

#### What is the claim for?

The claim is a financial claim for 'reasonable (financial) provision'. A person bringing a claim must first show that reasonable financial provision was not made. If this is accepted, the court will consider what reasonable financial provision might be.

What might constitute reasonable provision will depend upon the facts of each case but will include factors such as the size of the estate, the needs of the claimant and the financial needs of anyone else benefiting from the estate.

#### Do the wishes of the deceased matter?

There can be many reasons for not including someone in a will—relationship breakdown, a desire to benefit someone else etc. If those reasons are clear and rational, will they be ignored if a claim is bought under the Inheritance Act? The short answer is that a court will consider the deceased's wishes but they are not bound by them and can make an order for provision regardless. If you are making a will that is likely to prove controversial, it is wise to include a written note explaining your decision, which also helps to prevent other claims, such as lack of capacity. Whilst helpful, the statement is not likely to be decisive.



## **Dulverton Exmoor Literary Festival**





# Pine martens—a return to Exmoor?

Plans for the possible reintroduction of pine martens to the South West of England were announced recently by a partnership of leading conservation organisations.

Pine martens are part of the weasel – also known as mustelid – family of animals. Other members include stoats, polecats and otters. The species disappeared from the region around 150 years ago.

Now a partnership of conservation bodies including Dartmoor National Park Authority, Devon Wildlife Trust, Exmoor National Park Authority, the National Trust and the Woodland Trust hopes to reintroduce the species.

Together the conservation bodies have launched the Two Moors Pine Marten Project to explore the possibility of bringing pine martens back to the region. The plans are being seen as an important positive step in response to the wider crisis facing the UK's nature.

In recent months, the partnership has begun discussing the proposals with local people, farmers, landowners and other stakeholders in two areas – one in Exmoor National Park, and the other in Dartmoor National Park. These discussions are planned to continue for the next 18 months. The first pine martens could then be released in stages, beginning in autumn 2024.

The pine marten was once Britain's second most common carnivore, until a loss of habitat and persecution led to their drastic nationwide decline,

and their extinction from South West England in the 1880s. Now it is Britain's second least common carnivore and is judged to be 'critically endangered' in England and Wales. Populations have survived in Scotland and parts of Northern England, while successful reintroductions have taken place recently in Mid Wales and the Forest of Dean.

Pine martens are seen as a vital missing part in thriving and fully functioning ecosystems, especially the nation's woodlands. In 2021, an expert-led study by the Vincent Wildlife Trust, with the support of Natural England and NatureScot, identified the South West as the most suitable and highest priority British region for pine marten reintroduction.

The Two Moors Pine Marten Project is working with experts and local stakeholders to determine what the animal's reintroduction would mean to other wildlife, agriculture, shooting estates and woodland management. If reintroduction were to take place, the animals' progress would be closely monitored by the project.

Pine martens are solitary animals and most active at night. They live at low density, with a few animals spread over a large area. Their diets are made up of bank and field voles, plus wild berries, insects, birds, eggs and squirrels.



# Alfred Vowles Photographic Competition

Alfred Vowles was born in 1882 and was a well-known local photographer who, until the late 1940s, devoted his life to recording the landscape, life and people of Exmoor.

For many years he ran a thriving business selling postcards of his work from a shop in Minehead, having earlier worked for Kodak in London. Alfred Vowles's legacy is a valuable historic documentary of Exmoor and the competition's aim is its continuation.



A session inside the huge inflatable dome can inspire all ages, with a 360-degree immersive space experience. It's especially amazing to see how it captures the imagination of children.

The Exmoor Dark Skies Festival 2022 is going to be the biggest ever, with well over 50 events taking place during late October. # **Minehead Museum**

Fully reopen for the 2022 season after the Covid years, 10 May 2022 saw Minehead Museum welcome its 50,000th visitor since the museum first opened in 2014. Mrs Bernadette Evans, from Cardiff, reflected the sentiments of a much earlier visitor who said: "This little museum deserves to succeed...my father has lived in Minehead for 35 years; even he learned a great deal about his adopted home town...there's plenty to interest all generations...Minehead has a fascinating history and is far more than a sleepy seaside town at the end of the A39."

While the Museum remains small, some of its exhibits are not, including a full-size Hobby Horse, currently sitting opposite one of the museum's latest exhibits—a beautiful scale model of the now-dismantled pier, which used to welcome the paddle steamers that plied the Bristol Channel from 1901, when it opened, until 1939—when WW2 intervened and it was dismantled by the War Office—the only pier to have been thus removed.

The Club Committee are busily planning for the start of the 2022/23 programme when we meet again at Petroc in September.


More details will follow by e-mail to those on our mailing list during August, and this is an interim up-date for your diaries.

### Applying for a job?

At Citizens Advice, we value diversity, promote equality and challenge discrimination. In a difficult economic climate our need to earn a living is especially important. Our Advice Column this month highlights useful information for anyone in the jobs market.

"I recently applied for a job at a local pub which offered the National Minimum Wage. After a short interview, the manager asked me for some documents and also how old I am. After telling her I am 25, she said she would be in touch but it was unlikely I would get the job as they wouldn't be able to afford to pay me the required wage. She said she would prefer someone younger. Is this legal?"

Here is our advice...

Nobody should be asking you your age at an interview. At 25 you're entitled to the National Living Wage. Full details of the legal pay people are entitled to are on the Citizens Advice website. However, the rules don't mean that employers can avoid hiring people because of their age. That is 'direct age discrimination' as stated in the Equality Act 2010. You're also protected by the National Minimum Wage Act 1998, which says employers can't *not* hire you or fire you just because your age means you are entitled to a higher rate of pay.

Citizens Advice website has a wealth of information about what to do if you're being treated unfairly when applying for a job and there are steps you can take to either get compensation or persuade the employer to give you a job. The website gives advice and guidance with every step: www.

citizensadvice.org.uk/work

- As soon as you can, make a note of what happened, what questions were asked, and other remarks made by the interviewer.
- Write a letter of complaint to the employer and keep a copy.
- If that doesn't result in a satisfactory outcome, you could take the employer to an employment tribunal but you will need to pull together as much information as possible, including the job advert and your full notes on what took place.

If you are taking the tribunal route you have three months minus one day from the date of the interview to start proceedings and, if you need help and advice with this, you can also contact ACAS www.acas.org.uk who specialise in employment issues and provide advice free of charge.



# Travels from Dulverton


