Dunster's Conygar Tower

The Conygar Tower in Dunster, Somerset, was built in 1775 and has been designated as a Grade II listed building. It is a circular, three-storey folly tower, built of red sandstone, situated on a hill overlooking the village. It was commissioned by Henry Luttrell and designed by Richard Phelps, and stands about 18 metres (59 ft) high, so that it can be seen from Dunster Castle on the opposite hillside. There is no evidence that it ever had floors or a roof. The name *Conygar* comes from two medieval words coney, meaning rabbit and *garth*, meaning garden, indicating that it was once a warren where rabbits were bred for food.

The photo shows the Red Planet (Mars) above the top left of the tower and Pleiades (our local star cluster) directly above the middle of the tower. Photographer, Roger Shattock, and his partner, Kelly, love exploring the local outdoors and both enjoy being creative, so this shot was challenging and fun to create.





Getting fit, keeping fit

With spring on the horizon, many of us are looking forward to leaving winter behind and getting out and about more. For some, this might include taking up a new sport or fitness activity and, when it comes to getting fit, southern Exmoor has plenty to offer—both indoors and outdoors.

If sport or martial arts are your thing, you really are spoiled for choice: from cricket to netball, short mat bowls to snooker, and croquet to karate, there are local clubs happy to welcome new members. There is a comprehensive list of sports club contacts in our local directory at the back of the magazine and details in several *Exmoor News* adverts. If you are interested in a particular sport but unsure if it is right for you, it's worth getting in touch with the club to see if it's possible to attend a session and have a go or simply watch! We've been taking a look at some of the sport and fitness activities on offer locally and, at the end of this article, you'll find contact details for all the clubs and classes mentioned.

However, if your main aim is to become fitter, with a focus on muscle toning, improving balance, core strength, or flexibility, for example, but without the competitive element of sport, then an exercise class, could be right for you. Linda London (see page 27) runs fitness classes in Brushford and Dulverton and some are specifically designed for people over 50. Jackie Kelly (see page 14) offers a range of classes at her health studio in Dulverton and online; these include kettlebells, tone and sculpt, and full body dumbbell sessions.

Table tennis is a great way of keeping fit and improving brain function too, so it's an ideal activity for older people, as well as young; there are sessions for all ages at Brushford Parish Hall on Friday afternoons. Dancing is another excellent way to keep fit and improve your coordination; Wivey Folk Dancing meets twice a month at Wiveliscombe Community Centre and the emphasis is on enjoyment rather than perfection! Yoga and Pilates are also suitable for all ages; classes are more popular than ever, and many leading sportspeople and dancers now include either or both in their fitness routines. It's never too late to start and you'll find classes at village and community halls across or close to southern Exmoor. Pat Bell (Yogability) offers hatha yoga sessions in Bampton, Yeo Mill, and at Anstey Community Hall. Nancy Tapia of Edgemoor Pilates runs classes at different levels at various locations, including Oakford Village Hall and Anstey Community Hall. Nancy and Pat deliberately keep an upper limit on class numbers, to ensure that they can offer individual advice and guidance and suggest adaptations. In yoga, for example, this might include seated postures.

We are, of course, blessed with plenty of water (not just rain) here on Exmoor and Wimbleball Lake Activity Centre offers a variety of water sports and land-based activities, from family canoeing and paddleboarding to high ropes. And Exmoor's rivers offer some great wild swimming spots, including Tarr Steps and Landacre Bridge.

The one exercise most of us can do is walking, which brings a wealth of health benefits, mental as well as physical, as dedicated dog owners will attest. A daily walk, ideally at a brisk pace, is one of the best things we can do for ourselves as we get older. If you don't like the idea of walking alone, why not join one of the local walking groups? Get your week off to a good start on Monday mornings with Bampton Wellbeing Walks or Dulverton Health Walks (see page 32) on Tuesday mornings. The Exmoor Society runs guided walks across some of the most picturesque and spectacular parts of the area (see page 24).

If you are a Somerset resident, you can find out more about sport and fitness activities near you on the Somerset Activity & Sports Partnership (SASP) website. Active Devon has similar information for those of you who live across the border! As with all sporting and fitness activities, do check with your GP or health professional before you start, particularly if you have recently had any injuries or surgery, or have any longstanding conditions, such as arthritis or osteoporosis, or if it is some years since you have taken regular exercise. If you do have any long-term conditions or mobility issues, look for a teacher or trainer who has experience of working with people with different conditions, as they can help you adjust or adapt accordingly and exercise safely.

The key to getting fit and staying fit is to find something that you really enjoy, because once you start, you won't want to stop. You could be making new friends too.

Spring cleaning our bodies and our homes

Spring is here and with it comes new growth and change. It is hard not to feel more joyful with blossom blooming and daffodils brightening up the verges. For many of us, spring also brings with it the desire to spring clean. It is thought the tradition goes back to the Persian new year, Nowruz. This coincides with the first day of spring and translates to "cleaning" or "shaking the house." More recently, houses were kept warm by fires and, with windows shut, this would cause an accumulation of soot and grime. Cleaning and decluttering is also great for our mental health and detoxing our bodies.



Our cover image for this issue—Stag in the Rain—was taken by Jochen Langbein .

Dr Langbein is a mammal ecologist who came to Exmoor in the early 1990s to lead a Southampton University project, funded by the National Park, National Trust and several other organisations, into the ranging behaviour and impacts of deer grazing. At the end of the project, having fallen in love with the area, he and his family settled on the edge of Exmoor and set up Langbein Wildlife, ecological consultants, specialising, over the past 35 years, in deer research and management advisory work across the UK. Jochen's main passion, though, has always been photography and, in particular, filming wildlife behaviour;

Bird Box Monitoring Event May 2023

he combined this initially by using CCTV and, latterly, remote wildlife cameras for his work whenever possible. The cover picture was taken on a very wet day during the 2019 red deer rut, but the deer were very inactive, sheltering under trees, with rain pelting down all day. By contrast, Jochen took a picture of an Exmoor stag and calf was taken in mid-September the same year, during the early part of the red deer rut, when the stag was already busy roaring and gathering his harem. It's hard to believe that as I write this article we are already at the end of January 2023 and it has certainly been an interesting start to the year with floods and then snow. It is inspiring, albeit early, to see signs of spring on the horizon, with seasonal flowers starting to poke their heads through the soil.

During the past twelve months, the property market has certainly been interesting: from war in Ukraine, interest rates, cost of living and changes in government. However, the property market has once again proved how resilient it can be in the UK!

In real terms, the property market in the South West tends to fare better because it is still a popular place to live. The South West is still one of the 'Top 3 Places' to live in England for those seeking a 'better' lifestyle and a slower pace of living. Mortgage rates have certainly started to settle (despite media speculation), with rates at competitive levels and fixed rates available from high street lenders. This compares to where rates were back in November 2022.


Cows will bend their heads to breathe in the essence of their offspring each having a sacred identity perfectly loved in this march of spring.

On the Mount in Rural Devon

Every year on the penultimate Sunday in September, the vicar of St John's Church, Hyde Park, London, appears on horseback in an established tradition known as Horseman's Sunday. A cavalcade of over 100 horses and riders parade to the church in order to celebrate horse riding in the heart of London. The event dates back 40 years, its original purpose being to highlight the need to maintain stables along the north of Hyde Park.

Somewhat closer to home, the Revd Claire Curtis sent me a message: "Do you remember," she asked, "we had a chat a while ago, when I joined the Exe Valley Mission Community, and I said that I wanted to pray-ride that is to say, I planned to pray around the parishes on horseback?" I remembered our conversation, of course, and I was intrigued to know how events had moved forward in the interim.

The Exe Valley Mission Community consists of nine separate rural Anglican churches, which cover a wide geographical region to the north of the Tiverton area. These are in the villages of Calverleigh, Cruwys Morchard, Loxbeare, Oakford, Rackenford, Stoodleigh, Templeton, Washfield and Withleigh.

I visited Claire and found her brimming with excitement about the long-term loan of 18-year-old Bertie, a soft and gentle, sturdy, white Highland pony, whom she describes as a "complete answer to prayer." She was keen to tell me how Bertie's arrival came about.

Claire was ordained as a deacon in 2021 by Robert Atwell, Bishop of Exeter, and ordained priest in September 2022 by the Rt Revd Jackie Searle, Bishop of Crediton. "It was an emotional time," Claire told me, frankly. "I knew I wanted to pray-ride, but I had no idea of how to bring the concept into reality. Recently, the time felt right, and I began to pray for the ideal solution, which was for a gentle, kind horse to come my way. After just three days of prayer, a message popped up on social media, from someone local looking for a person to exercise her horse."



Claire said that she felt strongly that God was sending a clear message, saying: "Tell her your story!" So, she contacted Kim, the pony's owner. "I told her that I am a vicar and that it was my dream to be able to ride a pony to spread God's word in the community in a unique way. But I learned that Kim didn't want to lend her horse out to another location. She was looking for someone to go to her home and ride him from there; however, my story interested her, and she wanted to learn more.

"It was brilliant news!" Claire went on, "and we agreed to meet up for a ride together to chat further."

Claire and Kim rode out twice and, after visiting Claire at her home in Templeton, and further discussion, Kim agreed that she could have Bertie on long term loan, saying, "I couldn't wish for a more wonderful home for him, and I can see he has more work to do."

Claire told me that Bertie arrived with a comprehensive wardrobe of tack, rugs, blankets and toys. He has settled in well to his comfortable stable.

Claire describes her thoughts about riding Bertie around the parish: "It feels refreshing and ancient at the same time. It's a natural thing to do and people respond with such pleasure! The Diocese of Exeter's vision is, 'Growing in prayer, making new disciples, serving the people of Devon with joy' and this feels like an important part of my ministry. People don't expect to see a woman wearing a dog collar riding a horse, and it certainly makes them smile and engage with me!"

I spent a delightful and joyful morning with Claire and the gentle, obedient Bertie. We had a window of beautiful weather that made for some great images, reflecting the special affinity between rider and pony. Claire's enthusiasm and heartfelt joy about her answered prayer is indeed something beautiful to see and share. I have no doubt that in the future the "riding reverend" will become a familiar sight along some of the countryside's ancient green lanes..



Endurance GB—Busy Philippa!

The last time that *Exmoor News* talked to an endurance rider, it was Charlotte Noel, from Exford (in 2020), and Charlotte was in her sixties. She had entered her Argentine polo pony in a 40k novice class at the Festival of Endurance and had finished second, and was first past the post in the Red Dragon that year. She told us, "It was ridiculous; I was awarded the most exciting newcomer at a gala dinner and I'm 63."

Here we are again, in 2023, chatting to Philippa Verry, in a very similar position, so we asked her, "What is it that attracted you to this sport?"

"I would say endurance is a wonderful sport. Horse welfare is paramount and everyone helps each other, even though it's competitive. In my twenties, I won a dressage scholarship at Windsor Park Equestrian Club, with John Lassetter. I've hunted with various packs and even performed at Olympia. This just seemed a natural progression." Competitively speaking, at 60, and in the

form of your life having taken up endurance just six years ago, how did this happen?

"I bought Stilton to hunt, as after 10 seasons with the incredibly strong, Melitta, I rather fancied the idea of an easier ride! During the summers, we began taking part in the pleasure rides on Exmoor. It led us to graded endurance rides. Stilton has upgraded to open level, as he has now earned national placings and we finished fourth in the two-day, 80km Exmoor Golden Horseshoe Ride last year. When he took a well-earned rest after that and, with a bit of extra fitness training, I brought Melitta back into work to take Stilton's place in a competition in Dorset. She came second. I couldn't believe it! So I entered her into another competition in Cornwall and she won it. She's come into the sport aged 18, having hunted all her life. Any horse can do endurance, they just have to enjoy it." You have recently published a manual of Exmoor Bridleway Rides, in which you give so much detail. How do you fit it all in with running a small farm of beef cattle and sheep as well?

"Researching and mapping the routes ensures Stilton and Melitta are kept fit for competitions and I'm so lucky to live by Exmoor; it's the best natural training ground for endurance. I picked up a reconditioned GoPro that I wore as I rode through the routes. It took pictures and recorded my voice so I was able to transcribe it all easily when I got home." You've also designed three routes for this year's Golden Horseshoe competition from 25km to 40 km and 80km?

"I plotted the routes joining the best bits together for the riders to enjoy. What help might be given?


The help offered by Good Neighbours may include:

DID YOU KNOW?

Understanding a dog's movements can aid us in determining less obvious underlying illnesses or health issues. For example, choosing to sit or lay down rather than standing could be a sign of discomfort or weakness in your dog. A funny walk like skipping could indicate an issue with its knees.

Bunny hopping could indicate a weakness or pain in its hips.

Changes in a dog's coat e.g. hair sticking up, curls and/or zig zag patterns could be a sign of underlying muscle and soft tissue soreness.

Dogs are really good at hiding pain so the signs can be extremely subtle. Repeatedly licking their lips and yawning whilst being touched could be cause for concern.


We did squeeze in a day trip to Saunton Sands, managing to pick up a £100
