



#### Michael Morpurgo heads literary festival line-up

One of the country's best-loved children's authors and former Children's Laureate, Sir Michael Morpurgo, is taking part in this year's Dulverton Exmoor Literary Festival. The 2023 festival, which takes place on 18 and 19 November, builds on the success of last year's inaugural event, with talks by leading authors, a children's writing competition, creative writing workshops, and a pop-up bookshop.

Dulverton Town Hall is the venue for author events, which include Sir Michael in conversation with writer, Alice Thomson, and local author, Kate Lord Brown, interviewing historical biographers, Andrew Lownie and Catherine Ostler. Best-selling novelists, Sarah Turner, Hannah Richell, and former *Blue Peter* presenter, Janet Ellis, are taking part in a Book Club fiction panel. Sir Michael is also presenting the prizes for this year's children's writing competition.

Food writer and *MasterChef* judge, William Sitwell, returns to the festival to discover more about British wines with wine expert and writer, Henry Jeffreys. Julian Glover, author of the government's *Landscapes review: National Parks and AONBs*, joins Exmoor farmer and writer, Victoria Eveleigh, to discuss 'What is our countryside for?'

Guest speakers also include international portrait photographer, Harry Borden; writer and Condé Nast Britain's managing director, Albert Read; explorer, Belinda Kirk; survival expert, John Hudson; travel writer, Hilary Bradt; vet, Sion Rowlands, and sports reporter, Dennis Coath, with more writers expected to confirm.

Waterstones pop-up bookshop, which also hosts author book signings is back; there are creative writing workshops, and talks on a range of topics, including Exmoor's long lost railways. Online tickets go on sale later in the summer.

#### The canine physiotherapist's tale

Tucked away in a barn on the outskirts of Oakford is a delightful canine therapy centre, including an indoor swimming pool with spectacular views across the surrounding fields and hills. The casual visitor might be forgiven for thinking they had wandered into a pristine

spa; in fact, this is where Sarah Brick of West Country Canine Therapy helps dogs feel so much better.

When Sarah opened the centre five years ago, it was the realisation of a dream and the culmination of years of study, training and hard work. Her roots are in Hampshire: she grew up in an animalloving family. "We had many pets and I always wanted to work with animals," she says, "but my heart lies with helping dogs."

After leaving school, Sarah embarked on a career in veterinary nursing, while working at the Blue Cross as an animal care assistant. But, to qualify, she needed a placement as a student nurse at a veterinary practice; her thoughtful boss effected an introduction. This enabled Sarah not only to qualify but also to gain practical skills and experience too. Career opportunities for veterinary nurses are limited, so she expanded her horizons by becoming a locum, working at a variety of practices, and spending time as a volunteer at a dog rescue sanctuary in Cyprus, which she loved.

Back in the UK, locum work took her to Sevenoaks, where she met her now partner. "This grounded me! And from practice work, I went on to teach veterinary nursing at Hadlow College," Sarah explained. "But I missed the intensive nursing and hands-on caring for dogs. Physiotherapy, however, brought it all together beautifully. While working at Hadlow College, I studied at Nottingham Vet School for a Postgraduate Certificate in Veterinary Physiotherapy." She began offering evening physiotherapy sessions at veterinary practices and home

visits for dogs referred by local vets.

Meanwhile, Sarah and her partner, where planning a move. "We came to the South West and it stole our hearts," she says. Her partner set up his own business; they settled in Somerset, and Sarah went to work part-time at Bicton College. "I inspected veterinary practices to ensure that they met nurse training standards, and in my own time worked on building relationships with veterinary practices to build my physiotherapy business."

Pinkworthy Barn proved to be an ideal location; with support from her family, the necessary conversion work was completed, and West Country Canine Therapy opened in May 2018. But, in early 2020, just as the centre was getting established, Covid-19 and the first lockdown arrived; the centre had to close and veterinary practices were open only for emergencies. It was a blow and very hard for canine patients in the middle of treatment, so Sarah was determined that the centre would reopen as soon as this was permitted. "We set up all the right social distancing

measures and ensured a safe environment for everyone, following public health quidance."

Since reopening, the centre has gone from strength to strength. Sarah works with dogs from across Exmoor and





beyond, who are recovering from injuries or surgery. As well as those with chronic conditions, such as arthritis, that affect mobility. Sarah also treats dogs who need help with weight management or water confidence. They have ranged from tiny terriers to Irish wolfhounds. She spends time getting to know new patients, helping to reassure them (and their owners) and building up their confidence.

Sarah reassesses dogs on every visit. "As an experienced Veterinary Physiotherapist I have a wide choice of treatment techniques to apply, which may be carried out on land or in the pool, allowing me to deliver bespoke and individual treatment programmes. You have to watch, listen and respect what dogs are showing you, and make them feel safe. They're all different, but if you develop a bond with them they'll work with you."

All patients need a vet's referral but Sarah welcomes enquiries and is always happy to talk to owners about what might help their dog.

"I've found my place," she says. "it's a great feeling, very special."

#### Sarah's top tips to keep your dog moving freely:

- Do not work or exercise your dog when they are tired.
- Allow time for a warm-up and cool-down when exercising.
- Allow rest days.
- Let your dog sniff! Sniffing has a calming effect as well as exercising the brain.
- Manage their weight.
- Avoid excessive and repetitive activities.
- Good environmental management is very important. Review slippery floors, steps and stairs, and inappropriate jumping.
- Maintenance sessions with a physiotherapist.


### tiverton film club



# Rotary Exmoor Youth Challenge

On 20 May (later than usual), the annual Rotary Exmoor Youth Challenge took place on a lovely sunny day. The route had to be slightly modified because of the damage at Tarr Steps—since repaired! Based at Dulverton Junior School, over 500 young people took part in teams of four (aged 11-18, although the majority were juniors) in a 17-mile circular walk through eight different Remarkably, checkpoints. those taking part came from 55 different schools and youth organisations, which was great to see. The aim is to hit a pre-specified time between checkpoints, so it is not a race. Of those taking part, 436 completed the course, and received well-deserved medals at the finish—as well as a large slice of cake! Seventeen of the teams completed the whole walk within 10 minutes of the set times for each stage\*. This event is much appreciated by schools and parents, and it provides the real challenge of following a map and instructions, and teamwork; children are rightly extremely proud of what they have achieved.

This could not be organised without the support of over 100 volunteers from Tiverton and Exe Valley Rotary clubs, from the Exmoor Park Rangers, Exmoor Search and Rescue, St John Ambulance, and Exmoor Radio Club. Exmoor Rotary will also be involved in presenting illustrated dictionaries to primary school leavers at Dulverton, Bampton, and Bolham again, as part of their end of term celebrations in mid-July, an aid to their continuing education at 'big schools.'

# **World Drowning Prevention Day**

I wonder how many people are aware that 25 July is the date of the annual World Drowning Prevention Day? This global event is hosted by the World Health Organisation and overseen in the UK by the National Water Safety Forum.

With personal poignancy, the eighteenth anniversary of the loss of my 19-year-old son James to accidental drowning in the River Thames at Kingston falls on 28 July 2023.

I have more reason than ever to be a passionate advocate for water safety this year as I was fortunate enough to be awarded a BEM (British Empire Medal) in the King's New Year's Honours List; such an amazing surprise!

The citation to my award is specifically 'for water safety services in the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames'. This refers to our successful campaign with Kingston Council over the first three years after we lost James, to institute safety measure that have created the safer, lighter and brighter environment by the riverside that exists today.

When I look back to those early days, (not something that I do often), I can still recall my utter shock at seeing the lack of safety in the area where we lost James. I vowed at the time, "We need to do something about this to prevent further tragedies happening to other people". My grief fuelled the drive and tenacity to see through the project and I will always be thankful for the support that I had around me, to ensure that I kept the impetus going.

I gladly support water safety and drowning prevention initiatives through my collaboration with the RNLI and Fire and Rescue Services, and through sharing my writing and presentations on bereavement support.

Living in Mid Devon, we are equidistant from the Devon and Somerset coastlines, and close to many different bodies of water—the rivers Barle and Exe, the Great Western Canal at Tiverton, Wimbleball Lake and other Exmoor reservoirs. The popularity of wild swimming is increasing, and this is another area where people should be hyper vigilant towards personal safety and the effects of cold water shock.

Highlighting potential dangers in innocuous looking bodies of water remains key to the aims of the National Water Safety Forum. The latest statistics show that, in 2022, there were 226 accidental drownings, with more dying at inland water than at the coast. My heart goes out to these 226 families who are having to face the agony of personal loss.

The specific messaging this year includes: Should you see someone else in trouble in the water, remember Call, Tell, Throw.

**Call** 999—ask for Fire & Rescue if inland or the Coastguard if by the sea.

**Tell** the struggling person to try to float on their back.

**Throw** them something that floats.

Increasingly, there is evidence to suggest that knowing the simple steps from the RNLI about how to Float to Live can help you to avoid panicking and, indeed, save your life.

The BEM honour touches my heart in the sense of its being awarded out of personal loss, and it is a tangible demonstration of how hope can prevail despite tragedy.

The bells and whistles of the award—a Royal Garden Party at Buckingham Palace and the Investiture itself, were exciting events that will stay in our memories for a long time!

I not only hold a sense of pride on James's behalf, but also have a continuing commitment to the issues of water safety and grief support for the foreseeable future. Please heed the guidance and enjoy your time in and around the water safely.

## **New E-vehicles for Exmoor**

Exmoor National Park Authority is delighted to welcome delivery of two electric vehicles for its Pinkery Outdoor Education Centre: a Renault Zoe pool car and an electric Citroën nine-seater Space Tourer. These will help bring Exmoor National Park closer to carbon neutral goals.

Pinkery manager, Dave Huxtable, said: "This is great news for Pinkery, both in the pace our carbon neutral plan is moving forward now and it's also far more cost efficient. Since the vehicles don't require combustion engines or servicing, we are saving thousands of pounds a year."

Decarbonisation plans to power Pinkery sustainably are going from strength to strength, with the installation of a new biomass boiler. This is now complete and will be unveiled in the next few weeks.

Dave continued: "Over the next few months, we will also be increasing our battery provision, making a greener choice for any tools or equipment previously reliant on fossil fuels."

Exmoor National Park Authority CEO, Sarah Bryan, said: "This is a real boost to our carbon audit and climate



adaptation strategy. The switch to electric vehicles is part of ENPA's commitment to be net zero by 2030, and means that staff and visitors to Pinkery will be using green travel modes and reducing our carbon emissions.

"The solar panels and wind turbine at Pinkery also mean that we will be able to charge the minibus using any excess renewable energy on site.

"This will all help us to continue to provide sustainable inspirational and wellbeing-orientated activities at Pinkery, fostering understanding and connection with our local landscape for generations now and into the future."

#### **Exmoor Dark Skies Festival**

Each autumn Exmoor plays host to one of the UK's most popular Dark Skies Festivals, with over 50 events, suitable for all age, taking place around Exmoor. Events are already listed online for the 2023 festival, which runs from 13-29 October, and summer visitors are being encouraged to visit again—to get a full appreciation of a night under the starry skies of the designated International Dark Sky Reserve.

"Exmoor can boast some of the darkest skies in the UK—on a clear night, thousands of stars can be seen with the naked eye," said Katrina Munro of Exmoor National Park Authority, who organises the festival. "Autumn nights are ideal for stargazing activities and events due to the earlier sunset times. It makes it an ideal time for residents and visitors to experience the tranquillity and learn more about the skies above us and what we can see."

During events, there are experts on hand to guide novice stargazers around the night sky, and experienced walk leaders to take groups on dark sky adventures over some of the most stunning landscapes and darkest places in the National Park. For those preferring a more sedate evening there are

planetarium sessions, astronomy and wildlife talks combined with suppers, dark skies-related crafts, and wellbeing sessions including yoga under the stars. The many events for young families include the popular Astro Party, being held at Horner Farm, near Porlock, for the first time this year. There's also a sponsored moonlit walk around Wimbleball Lake, near Brompton Regis, raising funds for three local charities: Exmoor Search & Rescue, CareMoor for Exmoor and South West Lakes Trust.

## **Creating new meadows on Exmoor**

Meadows attract a multitude of wildlife and often support flora and fauna that struggle to thrive in other habitats, and are typically characterised by species such as black knapweed, oxeye daisy, yellow rattle, hawkbits, vetches and rarer orchids. They can also support colourful waxcap fungi with names such as parrot, snowy and crimson. Species-rich meadows are ecologically important as they provide areas for pollinating insects, nesting, food gathering, shelter and even animal courtship displays. Meadows can also be historically important, beautiful, and their enjoyment can contribute to our own wellbeing.

Like other ecosystems, meadows experience increased pressure due to climate change, especially as precipitation and weather conditions change. However, species-rich meadows have important climate change mitigation potential as carbon sinks; diverse and deep-rooted plants store a substantial amount of carbon in soil, and permanent grasslands help to protect soils, which can mitigate against soil erosion and flooding.





Over the last 70 years, there has been a drastic decline of meadows and species-rich grassland on Exmoor. Through their Sowing the Seeds project, Exmoor National Park Authority is encouraging landowners and communities to help restore, create, and link species-rich grassland. Botanical surveys, soil testing and monitoring are being conducted, and with partners such as Devon Wildlife Trust and the National Trust, best practices and skills are being shared.

There are events for landowners and the public taking place over the summer to help people learn more about meadow creation and restoration. Event details and a brand-new free Meadow Wildflowers of Exmoor Pocket Guide will be available soon from National Park Centres.

More equipment and training are needed, and a new wildflower nursery is being developed. Through the authority's donations fund, CareMoor for Exmoor, the public are being invited to support the Sowing the Seeds project. There is also a beautiful Exmoor meadows greetings card and certificate of dedication available in centres or online. (See picture).

# Caractacus Housing— 20 years on

Caractacus Housing is celebrating 20 years of helping locals stay local in the West Somerset and Mid-Devon regions. With second homes and holiday lets pushing up both rents and house prices to levels far higher than the national average, many people raised, living and working in the region have been forced to look for housing further afield, at the expense of commuting costs, loss of family connections and involvement in their communities.

The charity was established in 2003 to help those people who were struggling to remain local. Since then, Caractacus Housing has grown steadily, with the aim of contributing

to meeting the ongoing demand for affordable housing.

The charity now owns 20 properties, all tenanted to local people on low incomes in need of accommodation at a reasonable rent. The tenants range from retirees, to single people to families—people who all want to continue to live where they grew up, close to their families and friends, while working in the area.

Tenants benefit from a close relationship with the charity, well maintained properties, advice, support and the opportunity to apply for financial assistance with other costs.

Caractacus Housing hopes to continue growing and supporting more people in these communities in the future.



The number of people owning dogs has hugely increased since the pandemic confinement. This has resulted in a rash of accidents on Exmoor's farms, mainly with sheep, and in nearly every situation the landowners have been left to find out for themselves the devastation left behind (in some cases the livestock being left still just alive).

The first point for dog walkers is to check that they are on a public right of way because, if not, they are effectively trespassing on private property.

Second, if walkers are in any doubt whatsoever that their dogs may chase or harm livestock, they should be kept on a lead at all times. If an accident HAS occurred, please report it to the owner of the land on which you are walking.

We must all have experienced problems like this at one time or another!

"I've just had my bathroom retiled but I'm not happy with the work. At first, things seemed to be going well, then the tradesperson left to do another job and I had to chase them for updates. They eventually came back and finished the job, but it was pretty rough around the edges. They also left all the old tiles and plaster for me to dispose of, which I wasn't expecting. I've been invoiced, but I don't think the price reflects the work done or the service I got. Can I challenge this?"

You mention that the job 'looked rough around the edges'; if this is to a degree you consider the job unfinished or unsafe, you should be able to get the tiler to come back to fix it and also suggest removing the old tiles be considered part of finishing the job.

You are protected by the **Consumer Rights Act 2015**, which says that work should be completed 'with reasonable care and skill.' If they haven't done this, they've broken the law. The Act means you're legally entitled to ask the tiler to fix the problem (if they provided the tiles as well as the service), or get money refunded (if they just provided the service and you bought the tiles). They should fix the problem or refund you in a reasonable amount of time without causing too much inconvenience. As you've received the invoice for the work but not paid yet, now would be a good time to

ask them to fix the issue or negotiate a lower price for the work.

Let the tiler know you understand what you're entitled to. Speak to them or contact them in writing by letter or email. There are template letters on the Citizens Advice website: www.citizensadvice.org.uk/consumer/template-letters/letters/#sec55337

Make sure you have a written copy of

anything agreed. It's a good idea to take photographs to use as evidence of the problem—before you contact them. Make notes about what happened, including dates and times. Also gather any paperwork and receipts—was there any prior written agreement about who would dispose of the old tiles? Was the final cost in line with estimates or quotes given to you at the outset of the work? If not, further advice is available on the Citizens Advice website or you could **contact us** using our **free, local AdviceLine 0808** 

If, despite all efforts, you are still struggling to come to an agreement with the tiler, there are other steps you can take to solve your problem including 'alternative dispute resolution'. For more information, visit:



Speaking about their brand new show *Rave On*, which dives into the 1960s as well as the 1950s, Oliver says: "We've had the chance to explore material we've not covered before and create a show that moves into an exciting new decade. We didn't want to lose sight of the 1950s and, of course, the story of rock and roll starts here, but we started to ask ourselves: 'How could we explore the way the music travelled globally throughout the next decade?' We stop around 1966, just before psychedelia turns up. But who knows, maybe that'll be our next show".

Dan adds: "We are so excited to be fully back onstage in front of live audiences—every show feels like such a joy! Every note of *Rave On* is played live on stage with as much faith to the original recordings as we could find. We love these songs as much as the audiences do and hope to play a part in keeping them alive for new generations to discover!"

# **Travels from Dulverton: Chapter 5**

Joanna passed her MOT after a few essential repairs, so we can finally start planning some quality weekend getaways. With Dulverton as our base, we plan to park up in and around the South West, reporting back as the summer months roll on.

Spoilt with three Bank Holidays in May, we kicked off the last of the three (our first weekend away) with a Friday night in Lee. Its pink and grey rocky cove nestled in the North Devon coastline, Lee consists of 100 houses, mostly holiday homes, with a few fearless permanent residents that keep Lee ticking over.



The Grampus Inn is where everyone meets over the weekends for home-cooked food and live music—an open mic evening their regular Friday night entertainment. The music starts rather sedately at around 8pm. Veteran session musicians, local budding talent, the local takeaway manager from the neighbouring town and his KP, the bffs from uni down for the weekend, their rock star alter egos, playing a broad mix of classics and original works. Anything from Fleetwood Mac to accoustic renditions of Michael Jackson, Spanish guitar

to Motown classics and the Eagles. Somewhere between 9.30pm and 11.30pm, the atmosphere suddenly explodes as the chorus of the well-oiled crowd joins in singing. We were welcome to park up for the night in their car park; space is limited, so they ask you call ahead to book a spot. There is also a public car park a short walk away.

The following day we headed to Woolacombe, a surfers' paradise, with a number of expansive beaches separated by stunning rocky coastline. Facing the Atlantic Coast at the start of the Bristol Channel, ample parking, cafes and ice cream kiosks cater for most. The town gently slopes down to the beach, giving it a light sunny feel even on an overcast day. The tide sweeps out far for great paddling and rock pool investigations, as well as body boarding and surfing.

It's the start of the busy season for the wildlife too, making us extra vigilant on our travels so as not to run over anything. Lots of young rabbits bobbing about in and out of hedgerows. The deer are up and about dawn and dusk; young pheasants finding their bearings, as shoot organisers restock for autumn. Even baby squirrels gallivanting up in the branches are not safe; we have seen a fair few knocked out of the trees close to roads by fast moving heavy goods vehicles.

This is such a special time of year and we have been blessed with a good run of warm sunny days. The heat lasting well into the evenings, we have been lucky to spend some glorious evenings with family and friends, a chance meeting with a long lost nephew and learning the highly addictive Swedish game of Kubb, which is a very little bit like two-way skittles, with opposing teams rather than an alley. The perfect game for Dulverton as it's easily made with blocks of wood and sticks. A lovely way to pass the summer evenings.
