For the first time in three years, Wellhayes Vineyard at Clayhanger is holding a party—on Saturday 25 May from 12.30pm, to launch the release of the 2019 vintage.

The Wellhaves Sparkling Wine has won many awards and sells out quickly. Unlike the large champagne houses which have large reserves that are blended to ensure a consistent house style each year, Wellhayes owners, Simon and Alison Routh, make the wine on site in their traditional Devon bank barn, solely from the grapes grown in their one hectare vineyard. This makes each year a unique expression of the grapes that came off the field that year. With less than 2,000 bottles available, the 2019 vintage is described as having a fine mousse and lively acidity with a fresh taste of strawberry and a hint of raspberry, and is likely to be highly sought after.



### Managing perimenopause and menopause

#### Advice from local therapists

Menopause is a natural stage of life. Hormones are essential for women's health and changing levels can affect women physically and emotionally. As women approach the menopause, their oestrogen levels drop. As levels drop, the stress hormone cortisol can rise, which can easily trigger adrenalin in the body, leaving women feeing anxious and stressed. Variations in oestrogen levels account for the different symptoms and severity experienced.

Some women experience very few symptoms, while others have a wide range of symptoms affecting their whole body. The most common symptoms are hot flushes, night sweats, forgetfulness, brain fog, aches and mood swings, though there are many more.

#### **Claire Fisher – Reflexologist**

Reflexology can help to alleviate and balance both the physical and emotional symptoms of menopause. Hormones in women during perimenopause, menopause or postmenopause, are leading the body through a different stage of life. These hormones fluctuate and can be very erratic. ## **Macular Society Meetings in Dulverton**


#### Hallo again!

#### PASSWORDS

- Use a password of 15 characters and include  $\pounds$  and other signs if possible
  - A 7 digit password takes about a second to crack with a password cracker
  - The most secure place to keep a record of passwords nowadays is on paper
  - Note security warnings telling you your password has been compromised
  - Use different passwords for each site

#### Use 2 FACTOR AUTHENTICATION

- Use 2 factor authentication for everything
  - If anyone tries to login from an unauthorised device you will be notified

#### • EMAIL

- Watch out for links that are not secure
  - Check the link is valid e.g. <u>hsbc.com</u> or <u>hsdc.com</u>
  - http or https –is for secure and encrypts the traffic
- IF NOT SURE OF A LINK DON'T CLICK IT
- The current trend for criminals is to watch your traffic for a few weeks to make any scam credible

#### KEEP SOFTWARE UPDATED

- Ensuring you are connected to the correct site; Apple, Google etc
- SECURE YOUR HOME NETWORK WITH A STRONG PASSWORD
  - Why bother burgling you when I can sit outside and rob you

#### WATCH OUT FOR SMART DEVICES

• Many of these have passwords such as 0000

#### • PHONE SCAMS

- NEVER connect to your bank etc whilst on the phone to a caller
  - Hang up; phone from the number you regularly use preferably from a different phone as sometimes the phone can still be connected to the previous call
- NEVER give out your passwords over the phone



#### The Cricketer's Tale


If you have travelled along the Exe Valley on a summer weekend, you may well have spotted a cricket match under way at Bridgetown. But then it's hard to miss what is regarded as one of the most beautiful cricket grounds, not just in England but worldwide, with awards from Wisden in 2002 and the Daily Telegraph in 2008. This year, Bridgetown Cricket Club celebrates its centenary and who better to tell the story of the club than its newly appointed president, Doug Sherring? Doug's connections with the club, as player, groundsman, treasurer, and secretary, go back many decades; his pride in the club has never dimmed, as Exmoor News discovered when we caught up with Doug at the home he shares with his partner, Phyllis, at Golsoncott, near Rodhuish.

Now 77, a father of three and grandfather of six, Doug was born in Lydeard St Lawrence at the Friendship Inn, where his father was then the landlord. The family moved to Bridgetown when Doug was six; he went to the village school in Exton and then to the newly opened secondary school in Dulverton.

"I wanted to join the police force," says Doug, "but my father had a serious accident at work and I had to leave school and join the family firm." The firm was Sherring's Plant Hire and Doug, who was the eldest of eight children, would spend his entire working life there.

But, as a youngster in the late 1950s, Doug would meet someone who would, in many senses, change his life: Edward Roy Nesfield (always known as Roy, or Mr Nesfield, as Doug refers to him to this day) had been the land agent for the Miltons and Pixton estates and his passion was cricket. A cricket blue, Roy Nesfield had played for Worcestershire and the Somerset Stragglers and wanted to raise a cricket team locally. "He walked up and down the Exe Valley six times to find a suitable plot," says Doug. Roy Nesfield eventually settled on land that formed part of the

Miltons estate, just south of Bridgetown, which would become the club's permanent home.

"It was Mr Nesfield who got me into cricket and I was so lucky that he took me under his wing," says "Doug. "He became my mentor and was like a second father to me. I started by taking my kit down to the ground, just in case they were short..." Roy Nesfield also introduced Doug to the Somerset Stragglers—he remains a member to this day—and taught him how to prepare a wicket and care for the ground.

"He loved cricket so much," says Doug. "He even called the Bridgetown house that he built and shared with sister, Wickets!"

Cricketing legends, including Vic Marks, Derek Underwood and Joel Garner, have visited the club through the years, along with many UK touring teams, such as the Fleet Street Wanderers, and overseas teams—and who could blame them? It's hard to imagine a more idyllic sporting spot or a more welcoming club.

Much has changed in the world of cricket since the club was founded in 1924, not always for the better, according to Doug. In many cases, winning has become the driving force, rather than playing for the love of the game. Bridgetown, which once produced almost all of the club's players, has changed too; a century ago it was a busy village, with a shop, post office, pub and garage. These

days only the pub remains and most of the players live elsewhere.

If cricket and Bridgetown have changed, so too has family life. Children and young people are involved in far more sporting and other extra-curricular activities than ever and today's fathers are much more hands-on in their children's lives. Fewer young men are able or willing to give up their entire weekends during the season to cricket. Nevertheless, Bridgetown has enough players to field both a Saturday side and a Sunday side, enabling players to opt for one or the other (if not both) and it still prides itself on being a family club. Doug's late wife, Lynda, was always a keen supporter, as well as being responsible for producing the club's superb teas.

As well as a host of activities planned for the centenary, a major fundraising drive is under way to pay for essential improvements to the club's distinctive thatched pavilion, which is reached by a narrow wooden bridge. (The pavilion is also home to generations of swallows, who return there, year after year, to nest and raise their young.)

Although Doug's own cricketing days are over—he now plays golf at Minehead, where he can get around in a buggy (Exmoor weather and mud permitting) his involvement with Bridgetown Cricket Club continues. He's far too modest to admit that his presidency is richly deserved but he is clearly full of affection

for the game, the club and the sporting camaraderie that have been such a constant and important part of his life.

"Cricket has given me so many friends, lifelong friends," he explains, "and it taught me to respect other people." That spirit is still very much in evidence at Bridgetown Cricket Club, where new members and supporters are always welcome (see below for details).



Our spring doesn't start until these little birds arrive to brighten our days. Shortly after their arrival, we start listening out for the cuckoos, who have travelled similar vast distances to return to Exmoor, as they complete the spring symphony and provide the soundtrack into summer. These amazing creatures serve as an outstanding reminder of the resilience of nature and, as Exmoor transforms into its summer hues, the presence of swallows and cuckoos serves as a beacon of hope for better times ahead. In their simple way, these birds stimulate the collective consciousness to a more optimistic future.


All this, combined with the Exmoor Society walks and the Exmoor Running and Walking Festival, will provide visitors and locals with much to choose from.





## Great Bradley Bridge — building begins this year

Work gets underway on Great Bradley Bridge in Exmoor National Park's 70th Anniversary year, thanks to CareMoor for Exmoor donations. Funded by generous donors to the appeal, as well as the British Mountaineering Council, the Graham Keene Foundation and a local landowner, construction of this important 28-metre-long bridge over the River Barle can begin this summer.

A section of the footpath between Tarr Steps and Withypool, part of the long-distance walking route, the Two Moors Way, has been heavily eroded by flooding and Great Bradley Bridge will reroute walkers safely to the other side.

Bridleway users will also benefit. A recent donor has been the West Somerset & Exmoor Bridleways Association. Chairperson, Amanda Hamley, said:

"We are hugely supportive of the Great Bradley Bridge project

and are delighted to be able to make a donation towards its construction. The bridge will make an enormous difference to walkers and horse riders, enabling them to cross the river safely all year round, and joining up access to the bridleway networks for riders to enjoy."

Exmoor National Park CEO, Sarah Bryan, said: "We are delighted to see work beginning on this project; the new Great Bradley Bridge will be a crucial link in this route, making it easier for hikers and riders to explore the beautiful landscape. It will help to boost tourism in the region and support local businesses but, importantly, it will also protect local wildlife. The bridge will help reduce erosion and reduce disturbance to important habitats full of local wildlife from otter to pied flycatchers.

"We just want to say thank you to all the amazing people and organisations who have supported us with donations and helped get this project off the ground. While we've secured sufficient funding to make a start, we're not quite over the line yet and we would encourage those who love Exmoor to consider a small contribution to maximise this great opportunity for people and nature."

Final fundraising will help us complete the bridge and improve connecting paths.

We want to encourage a last push of fundraising to help complete the project. For a donation of £100 to our Great Bradley Bridge appeal, we will add a small plaque to the new bridge. This could be the ideal solution for anyone loving this popular route, which forms part of the Two Moors Way and offers families an important place to visit for years to come.








#### Damp and mould

Damp and mould is building up in our house. Our living room is worst and there's a strong smell so we have stopped

having friends round. We're also concerned about our health. We've reported it to the landlord who has done nothing. We've six months left on the tenancy agreement and running out of options. What should we do?

Absolutely right to tell the landlord but, to work out if they are responsible, you need to find the cause of the damp and mould, but this can take time unless it is clear there is a leaking roof or bad insulation. Damp occurs when property doesn't dry out. It can be rising, penetrating, construction or condensation damp and can lead



to mould, the fungus that grows

Your landlord is responsible for fixing a damp problem if it's making your home unsafe and unhealthy. They will also be responsible if the damp is related to repairs they should have done like rotting window frames. They would have to cover the cost of repairs to any items damaged by the damp including carpets and furniture.

Keeping homes well heated and well ventilated is the best way to

#### DULVERTON WEIR & LEAT CONSERVATION TRUST

In our last update prior to Christmas, we reported that DWLCT trustees held a number of meetings in the latter part of last year with directors, senior officers and elected representatives of Somerset Unitary Council, which now owns Dulverton Weir and most of Dulverton Leat.

The trustees confirmed DWLCT's willingness to continue the partnership that operated with the former owners (Somerset West & Taunton Council), and to join with the council in a fundraising programme leading to the restoration of this valuable historical asset. The trust's other partner's experience of fund raising and DWLCT's public

engagement, historical research and educational activities being particularly valuable in this regard.

We anticipate being able to share more news about our activities with Exeter University, the Mills Archive Trust and Bridgwater and Taunton College Creative Studies School (using music provided the London Symphony Orchestra and Sir Antonio Pappano) shortly.

It was recognised by all parties, however, that any successful fundraising initiative of this sort, requires at least a year (probably longer) before funds can be found to commence restoration and that, in the meantime, the weir and leat will continue to deteriorate. This would make restoration more expensive, and increase the possibility of the council breaching its ownership covenants, as well as damage being caused to the foundations of buildings adjacent to the leat (caused by the leat running dry and ground shrinkage).

The council has earmarked a small sum in the 2024-2025 budget to make the necessary temporary repairs to halt further weir deterioration and give a 'breathing space' to commence a formal fundraising programme.

The 2024-2025 budget is due to be reviewed by the full council later this month and we will update supporters as soon as we have more information.


#### **Notice from Exford Parish Council**

#### High Sheriff tours Exmoor tree nursery



The High Sheriff of Somerset, Robert Drewett, paid a special visit to key Exmoor National Park Authority sites, in its 70th anniversary year, to tour its tree nursery and Public Rights of Way furniture-making operation. He was shown around the 'Seed to sawmill' operation at the ENPA Exford Depot and the off-grid Pinkery Outdoor Education Centre near Simonsbath, learning more about access and education work and recent investments helping ENPA achieve its carbon neutral plans.

The newly extended Exford ENPA Tree Nursery has been funded partly by grants from the Devon Environment Foundation and the Forestry Commission, but also from donations to the CareMoor Woods and trees appeal, where native species of trees such as Sessile Oak are grown from ENPA gathered seeds.

Mr Drewett toured the highly sustainable sawmill and workshop, making signs and gates from locally sourced timber produced by conservation focused woodland management.

At Pinkery, he toured the centre's wind turbine and biomass boiler, which— along with a switch to electric vehicles and tools—are contributing to ENPA's actions to cut climate-changing emissions. He also learnt more about educational activities such as Young Rangers and discounted residential places at Pinkery for pupils in receipt of free school meals.

"It's been fascinating to learn about the wide range of projects ENPA are involved with and how they are leading by example

in sustainable operations at their sites," said the High Sheriff. "A lot of hard work goes into preserving our National Park, from rangers overseeing 1000km of public paths and bridleways across Exmoor, to the locally made wooden gates, stiles and iconic signposts in the Exford depot workshop.

"Activities encouraging young people to connect with our National Park, develop new skills and build confidence are also vital. I hope the team will continue to inspire future generations and help them develop a desire to care for and be part of Exmoor, to help sustain this special place for the next 70 years."

#### **Travels from Dulverton: Chapter 10**

We spent a wonderful few days over the Easter weekend exploring the Exmoor coastline. Starting in Watchet, we meandered westwards, taking in the traditional seaside atmosphere of

Blue Anchor, historic Porlock and the steep Alpinesque streets of Lynton and Lynmouth. The further west we went, the more rugged and demanding the landscape, steep inclines that would challenge even the most robust of drive shafts. The secret is preparation. A young boy skipped ahead, he lit their way carrying a tilly lamp. The moon shone bright in the background, shimmering off the sea as waves crashed into the rocky cliffs behind them.

The RNLI celebrates its bi-centenary this year. Equipment has improved a lot from the open wooden rowing boats of old; they have waterproof

clothing, life jackets to protect them, and boats with cabins to keep the rescuers and rescuees warm and safe, but the ethos is still the same. Locals volunteer to save the lives of others if the call goes out. It is now a recognised charity, with millions in the bank to keep it afloat. The people in the painting were born of a time before bank accounts and health and safety. Much tougher in many ways, but also probably a lot more straightforward.

If we had continued westward, our next stop would have been the Valley of the Rocks. A stunning must for anyone. An old witches' cave, fearless goats, the South West Coast Path and a very picturesque cricket field funded by Sir Christopher Ondaatje OC, CBE, FRSL, brother of Michael Ondaatje who wrote *The English Patient*. The views are second to done, dramatic and inspiring.

It seems there is no letup in the rain. Perhaps there is a global conspiracy to force the introduction of hydroponic indoor farms. Yes, they already exist, check out the practice of cloud seeding. Hopefully, May will bring some much needed drier and warmer days, and we can start getting out into some beer gardens for a refreshing pint of sparkling cider.

It is always tempting to perhaps keep one but apparently they don't do well indoors and are rather smelly. My boss took me to see some mums and their babies. Exmoor Longhorn show sheep, lovely looking chunky ones you see covered in snow on Christmas cards. Handsome rams-they have calm wise faces. It was a wonderful experience. I was lucky enough to get the chance to cuddle a lamb; it bleated for its mum but was warm and cuddly. They smell quite potent, but are totally adorable all the same!

We are probably going to have to sell our van, as insurance and road tax have doubled in the last 12 months, but adventures will continue in one way or another. Until next time.
