15 October *Anatomy of a Fall* (France). A courtroom drama mystery with first class acting, the film received the Palm d'Or prize at the Cannes Film Festival and was judged to be the Best European film in 2023.

19 November *The Zone of Interest* (UK). Based on the novel by Martin Amis, this was a prizewinner at the 2024BAFTAs and Oscars. It is a strong drama set in WWII, which addresses the contrast between domestic life outside and the horrors inside Auschwitz. The film does not enter the camp, but its presence is always evident from the award-winning background sound track.

10 December *The Holdovers* (USA). At last! Among the most popular films of 2024, it is a comedy drama set in a snowbound US college over the holiday period—ideal for our pre-Xmas choice. Another Oscar and BAFTA winner, described as, 'quick, funny, dripping with emotion and beautifully filmed.'

## The Farmer's Tale

Deep in the heart of Exmoor, on a 500 acre beef and sheep farm just outside Exford, can be found some very special and much-loved camping facilities, along with six holiday cottages—Westermill. A holiday or even a short break at Westermill Farm has nothing to do with glamping or yurts but, as four generations of loyal guests have discovered, everything to do with freedom. It is a justifiable source of pride to Oliver Edwards, the third generation of his family to farm at Westermill, as much a source of pride as his splendid herd of Aberdeen Angus cattle.

It is an idyllic setting; Westermill Farm is unique to the UK in that it does not border a road, but keeping the farm going and ensuring its legacy for future generations is hard and challenging work, not least in today's economic climate. But, from childhood onwards, Oliver has been no stranger to the challenges of work and life; there have been great joys

but great sadnesses too.

Westermill has been in this farming family's ownership since 1938, when Oliver's grandparents and his father, John, moved here from Barrow Gurney, just south of Bristol. 'There was a dirt track to the house, which was really just a bothy in the middle of nowhere,' says Oliver, who was born at Westermill in 1955. While he loved growing up on a farm, surrounded by animals and wildlife, his school years were miserable.

'I was dyslexic,' he explains, 'but in those days, it wasn't picked up. I was called lazy and a dunce.' Sent away to boarding school aged seven, Oliver remembers being caned every single week during term time. Not surprisingly, he hated school...It was not until he was a teenager and studying at what was then Taunton Technical College that he discovered what would become another lifelong passion—engineering. 'I received a distinction for the practical coursework,' he adds.

Engineering skills stood him in good stead when he decided, aged 19, to emigrate and leave for Australia. A "ten-pound Pom", he worked his way around this vast country on farms, as a jackeroo, at a winery, helping with flood irrigation for potential rice paddies, gardening, fencing, trucking, prawn trawling and looking after polo ponies, sometimes in the most hostile of environments. He

even spent time as a telegram boy. 'Everything in Australia is trying to kill you: at sea, on land, and in rivers, especially the Riverina snakes,' he recalls. But those years in Australia built an inner strength in Oliver; he is one of the most resourceful people you are likely to encounter, able to turn his hand to almost anything.

Back in the UK, after working in Malawi and Kenya, he met his sister's friend, Jill, who was working at the Westermill campsite to save up for her own trip to Australia. By the time Jill headed to the southern hemisphere, she and Oliver were engaged. It would be nine months before the couple saw each other again, by which time Oliver was working in Texas, where he and Jill were reunited. Despite the offer of a Texas wedding, they returned to the UK, were married in 1981, and have been at Westermill ever since.

Family life revolved—and continues to revolve—around the farm, and Westermill is where their three children, James, Charlotte and David, grew up. James, who works for Shearwell Data, and his family live nearby, as does Oliver's mother, who is 95. David works alongside his parents; he and his family live at Westermill, as does Oliver's mother-in-law, who is now 90. Although Charlotte and her family now live in Perth, Australia, technology enables her to manage Westermill's

advertising and campsite bookings remotely.

Scroll back a few years and things were going well. 'We were a happy, loving family, all living here,' says Oliver. But life and fate had other plans. In the summer of 2019, a routine screening test revealed that Oliver had bowel cancer. He credits the skills of his surgeon at Musgrove Park Hospital and the dedicated team at the hospital's Beacon Centre with saving his life. But chemotherapy was gruelling...'and not nice.'

And then came Covid-19. 'A dreadful time,' says Oliver. But he made a point of opening up the farm to trusted regular guests whenever possible. When restrictions prevented them from staying, Oliver sent videos of the River Exe, which runs through Westermill.

There was an even greater blow to come. Oliver proudly talks of his five granddaughters and his grandson but, at the end of 2020, his granddaughter, Amelia, died at the farm. 'It is the deepest wound for any family,' he reflects. 'You learn to live with grief but it was a most tragic loss for us all.'

With all that had happened, Oliver and Jill needed a psychological breathing space, away from the farm. Apart from an extended trip to Australia, when Oliver was sixty, they had only taken short breaks so, just as he had always done on the farm, Oliver put his engineering skills to good use. He built a camping trailer and, in 2022,

he and Jill hitched it to the farm truck and headed off to Barcelona, via the Pyrénees, paying a return visit to the region the following year. This summer saw an epic journey down through France and Italy to Bari, on Italy's heel, followed by a ferry to Corfu. The return journey took them to Ancona on Italy's Adriatic coast and from there to Switzerland and France, before returning home. 'Six weeks, twenty-two campsites, 4,000 miles...' Next year, Oliver will be seventy and he and Jill are contemplating a return visit to Australia or, if not, then taking the camp trailer up through Sweden and Finland, and to the top of Norway. Meanwhile, succession planning is under way at Westermill, with David taking over its day to day running. It is hard, however, to imagine Oliver retiring completely. 'Work is my hobby,' he says. 'I love this farm!' As did Oliver's father, John, whose richly detailed memoir, A Lucky Hill Farmer, is worth seeking out.

Writer, Lawrence Durrell, often referred to "spirit of place"—something that goes beyond a physical location. It is about the people of a place too. In Westermill's case it is very much about Oliver and the five generations who, for almost ninety years, have called this unique part of Exmoor home.





## Woolacombe—Country's Top Surf Lifesaving Club

Woolacombe Surf Lifesaving Club (WSLSC) has been awarded Super Lifesaving Club 2024 across all national lifesaving competitions, in the pool and on the beach. Surf lifesaving is a growing national sport, with over 10,000 Surf Lifesaving GB (SLSGB) members, a figure that grows every year. It's the sport that trains future beach lifeguards and teaches people how to stay safe in the ocean. Members train on our beaches throughout the summer, and in the pool during winter. WSLSC is very lucky to train at one of the world's best beaches, which is cared for by Parkins Estates Ltd. Clubs from around the country take part in regional championships, culminating in the Surf Lifesaving GB National Championships, in the swimming pool and on the beach. Woolacombe's competitive season started with the Nippers, Youth, Open and Masters—all winning the Devon regional pool and beach championships.

The Open Beach Championships, the last event of the season, took place at the world-class Fistral Beach in Cornwall. Woolacombe came third behind two of their big Cornish and Welsh rivals. Once all nationals have taken place, every point for each age group is totalled; SLSGB crowned Woolacombe the SLS Super Club of 2024, by more than 200 points—an epic achievement. 



## A Country Property Diary

It's hard to believe that we are already into October, leaving behind a summer that sadly hasn't presented us with the best of weather!

The West Country still proves and remains a popular choice for buyers to relocate to, as well as many local buyers buying within the area. Prices are holding strong and coupled with encouraging changes to mortgages for first time buyers. Nationwide is now allowing first time buyers to borrow six times their earnings!

As we approach the Labour government's first budget release on 30 October, speculation surrounds potential changes to key areas such as Inheritance Tax and Capital Gains Tax. While the specifics remain uncertain, these are some of the areas where adjustments could occur, along with both council and land taxes.



The Bank of England (BoE) has kept interest rates unchanged at 5 per cent, following last month's reduction from a 16-year high of 5.25 per cent. This decision was largely anticipated after core inflation surged to 3.6 per cent in August, despite headline

inflation remaining steady at 2.2 per cent. The BoE's cautious approach highlights its concern over persistent inflation pressures, and signals that the central bank expects inflation to rise again toward the end of the year.

Malcolm Webber, Managing Director of Webbers Property Services, remarked: 'This decision is no real surprise. Many colleagues and industry commentators had expected rates to be held, given inflation remains at just over 2 per cent. With the recent launch of sub-4 per cent fixed-rate mortgage products, we foresee a gradual reduction in interest rates over the next 12 months, which will build

confidence and enable more robust long-term financial planning.'

He also expressed hopes for the upcoming autumn budget, stating: 'We do hope the government considers measures to help first-time buyers and recognises the importance of retaining investor confidence in the local rental markets.'

#### **Propertymark's Perspective**

Nathan Emerson, CEO of Propertymark, noted: 'Since the initial rate cut a few months ago, many have been closely watching for further reductions. However, it is crucial that the Bank of England proceeds with caution to avoid reversing economic progress.'

Emerson emphasised the need for consistency and a strategic approach to future rate cuts, saying: 'Propertymark is keen to see long-term stability, confidence, and affordability within the economy.'

This decision will continue to be closely watched as inflationary pressures persist and the market awaits further guidance from both the BoE and the government.

#### **Seasonal Affective Disorder**

With the winter months in full swing, I have noticed a rise in Seasonal Affective Disorder known as SAD. It is a form of depression that commonly occurs during the winter months.

We all suffer from low moods but, with depression, you consistently feel low and it affects your everyday life. It can occur both temporarily (seasonal, bereavement) or long term.

The signs and symptoms of depression, such as SAD, are on a sliding scale; at first you may notice feeling 'off' and behaving differently—avoiding others, for example, even close friends; finding it hard to function normally; difficulty making decisions, and struggling to concentrate or remember things.

Other symptoms include:

- feeling sad
- tearful
- guilty
- restless
- numb
- not enjoying things/life
- feelings of helplessness/hopeless/worthlessness; a burden
- anxious or worried
- lack of energy
- suicidal thoughts
- changes in your appetite
- sleeping too much or too little

To help these symptoms, start by reaching out to close friends/family. If you notice your symptoms have continued for a long time, are more frequent and/or worsening, seek professional help from your GP or a counsellor.

As local businesses close due to staffing shortages, there's a growing need for authorities to prioritise housing for local young people to preserve community cohesion and rural life.

'Aaah.' A happy sigh travelled through the library as the Children's Section settled down to sleep.



# New MPs visit West Somerset charity

Two local MPs recently visited Wiveliscombe Area Partnership, a charity serving the people of the 10 Parishes, including residents of both MPs' constituencies.

Rachel Gilmour, MP for Tiverton and Minehead, and Gideon Amos, MP for Taunton and Wellington, both newly elected Liberal Democrats, joined the West Somerset charity to discover more about its work, and to see its iconic community transport vehicles. The charity runs an essential community transport service door to door, connecting rurally isolated residents from across the area, for example, taking them to important medical appointments in Taunton and Wellington.

Founded in 2002, the charity started the Wivey Link service with just one vehicle but now has five vehicles, including four with wheelchair access. They are operated entirely by volunteers. Over 600 residents are registered to use the transport service, and many of them have no access to public transport; the service delivered over 12,000 journeys in the last 12 months.

Volunteer Driver, Phil Gadd, spoke passionately to the MPs about the impact his volunteering has on the passengers he has got to know over the years, calling it a lifeline for many. 'I have been volunteering since 2010, and I do it because I know I can be a real help for people who don't get out of the house from week to week.'

The charity's chairman, Pauline Homeshaw, said: 'We are thrilled to meet our new representatives, not only to show them the important work that we do in their constituencies but also to hear about their interests and plans. Charities like ours have been hit hard in recent times and it is heartening to hear that Rachel and Gideon are as passionate as we are about the issues that impact our rural community.'

#### **Winter Fuel Allowance Withdrawal**

In September, it was reported that over 40,000 people in receipt of their State Pension had recently applied for Pension Credit. This was in the wake of the announcements that Winter Fuel Allowance was being withdrawn from every pensioner not claiming Pension Credit, and that energy costs are set to rise by around 10 per cent this winter.

Pension Credit is available to single people whose weekly income is less than £218.15 or couples with a weekly income of £332.95. If you receive Pension Credit, you could also be eligible for other benefits to help you make your money go further.

If you are already claiming your State Pension, you can apply online for Pension Credit at the gov.uk website or there is a Pension Credit Claim Line — 0800 99 1234 — which is open Monday-Friday, 8.00am-6.00pm. You can also download or request a form to fill in and post. You will need details of your income, savings and investments, and your National Insurance number.

The Department of Work and Pensions has also launched a Pension Credit take-up campaign following the changes in the Winter Fuel Allowance payment. The qualifying week for deciding who is eligible for the Winter Fuel Allowance is 16–22 September 2024 and you must claim by 21

December 2024 at the latest. That is the last date on which a fully backdated Pension Credit claim could bring about eligibility for the Winter Fuel Allowance payment. That said, our advice is to ring the Pension Credit Claim Line, because the trained advisers can quickly establish which questions are not applicable to individuals and answer any questions as you go along. It is well worth looking into and, if it seems a bit daunting, the people taking calls are trained to help you.

We may also be able to give you some helpful advice regarding fuel economy and efficiencies and we do still have energy vouchers available. Just go to our website www.citizensadvicetnmwd.org.uk or call us on our free, local AdviceLine number, which is 0808 27 87 999. We are here to help and even if it turns out that you do not qualify for Pension Credit, it may be that we can identify other help that is available to you.

## **Remedial Repairs to Leat Wall**

Dulverton Weir & Leat Conservation Trust (DWLCT) is pleased to announce that it has recently completed restoring Dulverton Leat wall in Northmoor Road, Dulverton. The restoration, carried out by local skilled tradesmen, was funded by a grant from DEFRA's Farming in Protected Landscapes (FiPL) scheme, administered by Exmoor National Park Authority (ENPA). Further restoration

of other parts of Dulverton Leat are planned for later in the year.'

## **Travels from Dulverton: Chapter 12**

As summer matures into autumn, it bestows its harvest, which we—to varying degrees—gather in for the harsher months ahead. Sloes for sloe gin, handpicked blackberries for the freezer, apples, wood for the fire, mushrooms, and rosehips, packed with essential vitamins to ward away seasonal sickness and ills. On a grander scale, farmers have harvested their crops. Grains, root vegetables, and greens harvested and despatched to supermarkets and wholesalers.

The pagans call this time of year Mabon; it is a time of gratitude, when families gather and feast at tables adorned with the deep hues of autumn, rich reds, oranges, and gold. The same colours used in harvest festival displays, the important connection between humans and land still recognised. This marks the start of our preparations for winter, and perhaps gaining a few pounds to insulate the body from the cold and wet. It's funny how we feel a bit more peckish over the autumn and winter months, our bodies in tune with the ebb and flow of the seasons.

The autumn equinox, when the hours of daylight and darkness are equal, fell this year on 22 September. There is a reflective feel in the air. For some ,the equinox marks a wind down, a time of reflection—for the spring and summer that has been and gone and in anticipation for the build-up of festivities that lead us towards the end of this year and the beginning of the new.

For some, it marks new beginnings. Children make the leap from the end of one academic year. The summer holiday was traditionally a time when city families would travel to the countryside assisting the farmers with the harvest, such as tattie howking in Scotland and hop picking in Kent. Families spent a few weeks harvesting crops, combining it with downtime, when parents and children and the wider community could escape the regular routine and earn their board and lodging.

This is also the time of year when first-year university students fly the parental nest. Weighed down with their brand new pan sets, duvets, and washing baskets, they speed off, excitedly waving back to their part-relieved, part-heartbroken parents. The lightness and darkness of their hearts in tune with nature's own transition into autumn, as the family dynamic matures along with the summer.

We haven't been out and about so much these past few months but an autumn trip to Cornwall beckons. Until next time...
