




#### Bampton Hidden Gardens 2025

The annual Bampton Hidden Gardens event for 2025 is scheduled for 28-29 June. This event owes so much to the generosity and hard work of the garden owners, who kindly open their beautiful gardens for visitors to share. As in a number of Devon villages, a lot of these gardens are genuinely hidden, and the weekend offers the chance to explore and be delighted at what is behind the stone walls. Across Bampton, and into the surrounding area, there are a wide range of garden sizes and styles to see. In 2024, 19 gardens were offered, 15 of them within walking distance of each other within the town. Visitors easily reach their 10000 steps!

Hidden Gardens tickets cover both days, from 11am-5pm, affording visitors the opportunity to pace themselves, and even to stay locally if they are travelling from further

afield. Within Bampton, a number of cafes are open for breakfast, lunch, afternoon tea, or just a much needed cuppa. Several shops also offer takeaway options to sit and eat in the sunshine (fingers crossed), on a bench whilst admiring the floral displays around the town. These are planted and maintained by the dedicated volunteers of Bampton in Bloom who run the Hidden Gardens event.

We look forward to welcoming visitors old and new, from near and far, to what is always such a lovely weekend.

#### The silversmith's tale

Skilgate-based silversmith, Cat Mills, believes that you cannot improve on nature. 'It has beauty down to a fine art,' she says. The landscape in which she has lived and worked for the past ten years embodies this, while her workshop, a former linhay (stone cattle shed) reflects another passion—repurposing materials. The workshop doors started life in a festival marquee...But it is in her work as a silversmith and jewellery designer and maker that her commitment to repurposing comes into its own.

The tranquil, idyllic setting that she now calls home is in sharp contrast to her early years, which were spent in Bristol. Both her parents have fine arts backgrounds, and her grandmother painted, so Cat's creativity is bred in the bone. In addition, she attended a Rudolf Steiner school: 'There was loads of making with hands...baskets, ceramics, metalwork... rather than subjects like IT or computing,' she explains. Cat has dyslexia, so a rigid academic curriculum was never going to be right for her. 'I love a puzzle, however; I like experimenting, working out how to do something, and coming out with the right result.'

At 19 she enrolled on a two-year silversmithing course, where her combination of creativity and practical skills

found a perfect outlet. 'Although I left after one year, it gave me the confidence and enough understanding to experiment and make things I like. Almost all of what I do now is self-taught.'

She started out teaching copper jewellery-making at festivals, then went on to host mobile workshops. Now happily based in a permanent setting, Cat has developed a way of working that suits her best, enabling her to make the most of her knowledge and skills, which she loves to share. As well as creating her own range of silver jewellery, Cat teaches small groups and individuals.

'I am a great believer in recycling, reusing and repurposing; in my own work I use scrap sterling silver and items from the natural world. Silver is melted down and then cast into designs or forged into organic shapes,' says Cat. The methods she uses, cuttlebone casting and sand casting, are among the most ancient.

Cuttlebone casting has a history spanning thousands of years, with documented finds in Germany dating back to the 6th-7th century. 'Cuttlefish casting is our cultural heritage; they wash up on our island shores. I'll spend days beachcombing for them, while picking up rubbish—so much plastic! Taking something from the sea and giving something back feels like an exchange,' she says. 'You can buy cuttlebone but I'll remember where mine came from: Wild Pear Beach near Combe Martin, or from Cornwall or Dorset.' And she encourages people attending her workshops to bring their own.

Sand casting, which dates back almost 3,000 years to China's Shang dynasty, is ideal for casting natural things in silver. She uses this method to cast items such as ammonites, hagstones, acorns, or oak buds and twigs. Hagstones are stones or pebbles with natural holes running through them and are shrouded in myth and legend. Many cultures regard the hagstone as a talisman, offering protection or good luck. And the concept of the talisman is one that has always fascinated Cat. 'Jewellery is deeply symbolic and highly individual; a piece has to look right, feel right on the body, and represent something. People often overlook the second and third elements.'

Cat's workshops offer people the opportunity to create something that they will enjoy wearing, something that carries a particular memory of a person, place or time. 'We don't start with what something might look like but what someone actually wants to wear. It might be a ring or a chunky pendant; a piece to wear every day or just on special occasions. Massive, or small and subtle! Then we start to make...'

Cat has always been drawn to symbols such as the triple spiral, a traditional Celtic symbol that reflects the way her three children inspire her work. It is the central feature of her Exmoor Silversmith logo and she often incorporates spirals into her jewellery designs.

'Every culture has something symbolic, as does every person's psyche,' says Cat. 'I love tapping into that. Finding out what's comforting to that person—a particular memory, or experience, say—really fires me up. It's something I try to communicate when I'm teaching'

Cuttlebone casting is an ideal process for this. 'It's easy to do and works quite quickly; you get a nice contemporary result. It's exciting to start with your aunt's old solid silver necklace, your mum's brooch or a napkin ring silver, melting it down into a liquid in a crucible, pouring it, and then taking it back to a solid—but a different solid. It's all

about that interpersonal connection and making a piece that you want to wear and cherish. I love taking people on a journey where they feel proud of what they've made.'

There is something uniquely atmospheric about Cat's workshop, a sense of alchemy in the air; it's full of the things she collects on the moor and coast, as wells as the tools of the silversmith's craft. It's warm, inviting and informal, an ideal setting in which to learn and make. Asked to name her favourite piece, Cat replies: 'It's always the next piece I'm making. Everything is a Chinese whisper of what I made before; for example, do I need to make something lighter of heavier? You can't be static with creativity; I'm always excited about the next thing—it draws me on.'

When she needs a breathing space, Cat slips away from home to walk to her special place, near water. 'There's so much beauty on Exmoor, so much to take in but without the distraction of city life; it's where I can really be myself.'





The Bank of England's recent decision to reduce the base rate from 4.5% to 4.25%, its lowest since May 2023, is a clear signal of improving economic confidence. Although the decision was not unanimous, it reflects a more optimistic outlook, supported by upgraded growth forecasts for the year ahead.

In the property market, lower borrowing costs are expected to support activity, particularly among first-time buyers. Mortgage products are becoming increasingly competitive, with fiveyear fixed rates starting from 3.83% and additional incentives available through green mortgages for energy-efficient homes.

#### **The West Country Picture**

In the West Country, we are seeing a noticeable shift in the market. Housing stock has increased by an average of 20% compared to this time last year, offering buyers considerably more choice. At the same time, buyer demand has risen



more modestly, currently around 8% higher, leading to a more balanced and competitive landscape.

This increase in available property is due to a combination of seasonal factors, growing seller confidence, and financial pressures. In particular, recent council tax increases have pushed a number of second homes to the market. For some homeowners, this rise in annual costs has prompted a decision to bring their property to market sooner than originally planned.

While confidence is returning, buyers remain value-conscious and selective. However, properties that are accurately priced continue to perform well. Across much of the region, strong offers are being received, and in Dulverton specifically, many properties have sold at full asking price. In fact, we have successfully matched buyers with local homes before they even reach the market, highlighting the strength of demand when properties are correctly positioned.

With values remaining generally stable, buyers are approaching the market with care and greater attention to pricing. Properties launched with overly ambitious price points may take longer to gain traction, whereas those introduced at a realistic, wellconsidered level continue to attract strong interest and achieve successful outcomes.



The recent interest rate cut is a welcome step that supports both economic sentiment and buyer confidence. In the West Country, where supply has increased and household budgets are being reviewed more closely, the market remains active. Sellers





The club's AGM approved this croquet trial for summer 2025. If successful, regular croquet sessions could become a permanent fixture in the 2026 season.

We have just finished compiling our Annual Reports for 2024-25, setting out our impact on local communities. The reports are available on our website (see below) and make for interesting reading. Inquiries about welfare benefits, energy, debt and housing remain key areas where people need our help. We have covered advice on all of these issues over time and shall doubtless be doing so again.

However, this month I'd like to talk about another aspect. of our work and ask for your help!

In-house we refer to our Research and Campaigns, which roughly translates into trying to make society fairer. This is every bit as important as the advice and help we give because it enables us to put pressure on the decisionmakers when we see something is unfair. Our charity is highly respected and people listen to us. We also maintain relationships with our local MPs and councillors. While maintaining the highest standards of confidentiality, we compile compelling data to support our causes. We support this at local and national levels and are very active locally, getting out and about in the community and undertaking surveys—a vital part of this work.

We recently published a report on the impact of the cost of living crisis based on our local research: Citizens Advice Torridge, North, Mid & West Devon 2024 Living Standards Report - Rural Devon Citizen's Advice. We were also delighted when Karen Plum, our Research and Campaigns volunteer received an Unsung Hero award at the recent Research and Campaigns national conference. She and our Team Leader, Laurence Atkinson, who heads our Research and Campaigns work, put a great deal of time and energy into this crucial aspect of our work. Which leads me to my request for help...

As part of a Devon-wide campaign we seek information from people experiencing problems with repairs in private or social rented properties. If you could complete a simple form for us, it would be really helpful; you'll find it at: www.forms.office.com/e/0gRCPqVggG

We can't try to resolve any issues you may have but it will help us to escalate what is a very real and widespread problem. We would also like to hear from you if you do seasonal work in the area and are on means-tested benefits, as this appears to be an issue for people finding it hard to make ends meet and needs serious review. 



#### **News from Exmoor National Park**

#### Nature and people focus for land at Driver



Exmoor National Park Authority (ENPA) is launching an ambitious programme of work at Driver, its 320 hectare land holding west of Simonsbath. In May, the ENPA Committee agreed a three and a half year development phase at Driver that includes:

At least five nature recovery projects.

A range of engagement and learning events, skills and activities, such as Young Rangers, Welcome to Exmoor days, and a programme of school visits.

Several projects that also focus on cultural heritage and social history.

Improved physical access across the land, to better connect our Pinkery Outdoor Learning Centre (see below) with Driver and nearby roadside laybys.

There is already a Countryside Stewardship Scheme in place for Driver, but the hope is that it will be replaced by entry to the Reviving Exmoor Heartlands Landscape Recovery scheme in 2026.

Our Sowing the Seeds project will continue to play

an important role in restoring Driver's meadows. Demolishing the end-of-life, 20th century farm shed, and making other improvements around the traditional farmstead, will improve site infrastructure. We are conserving and adapting the Victorian farm buildings, which will be adapted to support diversification. We are also recruiting the first Gateway tenancy to ensure ongoing land management in a way that supports our ambitions for nature.

Tackling structural issues at Hinds Pitt Bridge



ENPA has had to close a popular Somerset footbridge for public safety but we are working on a plan for a longterm replacement, and to reinstate public access on the permissive footpath that crosses Hinds Pitt Bridge above Hinds Pitt Pool, which forms part of the popular Tarr Steps circular walk

ENPA's Access and Recreation Manager, Dan Barnett, said: 'Unfortunately, the bridge had to be closed due to structural failure and for public safety. It has been there since the 1950s and some key parts of the steel structure have deteriorated to a point where they are no longer safe (see photos). We hope to replace the bridge and secure public access...but it will take some time to develop a plan in agreement with the relevant landowners and to raise the considerable funds required.

'It is possible that we can do some temporary modifications to allow the bridge to reopen while we plan for its replacement, and we are looking into that urgently. In the meantime, the Tarr Steps site is otherwise open for everyone to enjoy, including short walks there and back on either side of the river and all the longer walks in the area are fully open. The popular long distance footpath, the Two Moors Way, is still passable using an alternative route on the west bank of the river.'

#### Postcards from Exmoor...

The early years of the 20th century were said to be the golden era of postcards, as more people took holidays and explored different parts of the country. Postcards to family and friends were all part of the experience, keeping loved ones up to date with the sender's activities. Postcards sent more than a century ago are an endless source of interest for Dorset writer, Helen Baggott. She has already published three collections of postcard stories but has now used them as the basis for her novel, *Memories from the Future*, which is set on Exmoor.

In 1911, author Arthur Saville visits Exmoor, in search of letterboxing sites, where visitors have left postcards in jars or tins in remote locations. More than a century later, Hilary Holmes discovers Arthur's journal and postcards, which reveal an extraordinary genealogical puzzle that must be solved. She too heads off to Exmoor, following in Arthur's footsteps and the postcard trail, from Minehead, Porlock, Lynmouth and Lynton, to Simonsbath, Exford, Dulverton, Dunster, Selworthy, Watchet and Cleeve. In the 21st century, Hilary has access to a wide range of newspaper archives and the stories behind the postcards to life. Gradually, the pieces come together...

#### The Therapist Collection Reflections from our Clinic

#### Anxiety: Lisa Filer—Counsellor, Snowdrop Counselling Services

Anxiety is a natural emotional and physical response to stress. It activates the body's fight-or-flight system, but when triggered too often, it can feel overwhelming and difficult to control.

Chronic anxiety can make it hard to focus, sleep, or carry out daily tasks. Generalised anxiety disorder (GAD) is one of the most common forms. It involves constant worrying about everyday things and often feeling 'on edge.' It can impact work, relationships, overall wellbeing and is often linked to depression. Anticipatory anxiety involves excessive worry about future events, which can lead to sleep anxiety—stress and overthinking that interferes with the ability to fall asleep. Panic disorder involves sudden, intense panic attacks with no clear trigger. These episodes can be frightening and may cause dissociation. Obsessive-compulsive disorder (OCD) includes intrusive thoughts (obsessions) and repetitive behaviours (compulsions) aimed at relieving anxiety.

Talking to a counsellor can be a helpful first step in managing anxiety. Counselling provides a safe space to explore thoughts and feelings, identify triggers, and develop healthy coping strategies. Counsellors can help you challenge negative thinking and engage your rational mind, making anxious thoughts easier to manage over time.

#### **Migraines: Claire Fisher, Reflexologist**


A migraine is usually a moderate or severe headache felt as a throbbing pain on one side of the head. Many people also have symptoms such as feeling sick, being sick, and increased sensitivity to light or sound. Some people have migraines frequently, up to several times a week. Other people have a migraine only occasionally. Migraines also come with or without an aura, also with an aura but no pain. Migraine headaches have been linked to overwork, stress, changes in the weather or hormone levels, bright lights, dehydration, and food allergies. They can be debilitating, whatever the cause. Do consult your GP if you have frequent or severe migraine symptoms.

#### An unusual collection...

I have always been a collector. Initially it was Brooke Bond tea cards, cigarette cards and stamps. The spark for cartridge collecting started over 40 years ago, when a friend pestered me to find some for his collection. I found one old Somerset cartridge, the Somerset High Velocity, retailed by W R Bailey of Congresbury, to this day still the only one known.

Historically, travel was difficult so most villages would have had a blacksmith, shop or ironmonger who would retail cartridges with their own names and designs. As a result they are little pieces of history with retailers names and interesting designs; sometimes it is the only thing remaining of the business. One example is 'Stacey, Dulverton', a pre-1914 cartridge. Centre fires developed in the mid 1800s; Mr Daw lost a court case battle over the cartridge manufacturing patents. Eley brothers succeeded and to this day are still one of the main manufacturers.

My collection covers up until the introduction of plastic cases c1959 but extends to old cartridge boxes, reloading tools, related invoices and ephemera; for example, a whale marker for research, before electronic tagging was possible. A friend recently described my collection as a museum! Initially cartridges were easy to find. Not so now.


Mine is not the only unusual collection. I remember two; one of button hooks (about 600 items) and one of named building bricks (over 300), all preserving a small piece of history long gone. Thank goodness for a few slightly mad people out there with a collecting personality!


