

#### All His Rights\*—meet the artisan...

Meeting David Thorne for the first time, what strikes you is his total self-belief in his work. When he shows you the antler top walking sticks and hunting crops, for example, you can sense his pride in that work, and it is highly infectious!

This confidence is not surprising as he is self-taught. Brought up in a farming family, David learned woodwork and design at his Crediton school, before leaving with a few O-levels and returning to work on the family farm.

For nearly 40 years, he has put everything he possesses into building Penstone Country Crafts, sourcing the timber from local landowners and purchasing as logs. These are cut into planks and left to air dry for at least three years before kiln drying. David then undertakes private commissions, including hardwood kitchen tables.

Antler and oak table lamps and chandeliers have followed, reflecting his love of Exmoor and his lifelong passion for its wild red deer. Each of David's pieces embody drama

and skill and are a fine illustration of England's traditional artisan skills—long may they continue.



David is a regular at many local summer shows and point-to-point meetings but if you missed him this year, do visit The Farmers Den in Exford, where a selection of his work is on display.

As destiny pulls them together, so family, passion, and faith drive them apart. Nicholas's father, William (Pierce Brosnan), comes home one day to shatter his family's quiet, modest life. He quits his job and sets off for the coast, leaving his shell-shocked wife and son to fend for themselves. Meanwhile, Isabel and her family live a charmed existence on a nearby small neighbouring island, their house full of music and poetry. When tragedy strikes and Isabel's brother suffers a terrible accident, the music stops, and their parents (Helena Bonham Carter, Gabriel Byrne) decide, in their grief, to send Isabel to a convent school on the mainland. The young lovers embark on their own individual journeys of heartache and misplaced love, before fate contrives to pull the threads of their lives together.

#### Abbeyfield House Dulverton—home and community

Step across the threshold of Abbeyfield House Dulverton and you could be forgiven for thinking that you have walked into a stylish, warm and welcoming boutique hotel, set in well-tended gardens. And you will certainly be greeted with a smile. It is not a hotel, of course, rather a sheltered housing scheme that combines independent living with supported living for up to 10 people aged 60 and over—a close-knit community within the community.

And the warmth is not simply physical; it is human too, which is immediately apparent when you meet manager, Zoe Edworthy, for whom the happiness and wellbeing of the residents and the eight staff members are priorities. At the same time. Zoe has steered her team and supported residents through a major change in the organisational management of Abbeyfield House ambitious and overseen an continuing—refurbishment and programme.

The Abbeyfield Society was founded in 1956 in the UK by social reformer, Richard Carr-Gomm, to provide a supportive, community-focused setting for older people to live independently. Dulverton is now one of 100 Abbeyfield homes in England and Wales and one of 400 worldwide.

Originally overseen by a group of local trustees, it now comes under the regional umbrella of Abbeyfield Wessex. Despite this change, it is still very much at the heart of the town's everyday life.

This is not surprising, however, in the light of Zoe's own story. She has local roots, having been born and brought up in Exebridge, and has always lived and worked on Exmoor. For many years, her home has been in Dulverton, where she lives with husband Martin—everyone's cleaner—and favourite window daughters, Eva 16, and Lilia, 5. Like Martin, Zoe is a familiar face in the town. 'I have been part of the Abbeyfield team on and off for 10 years, but have also worked at the pharmacy, Brimblecombe and Farthings!' she explains.

During her time at Abbeyfield, Zoe has worked as a cleaner and a cook, before becoming assistant manager and now manager, which means she has a thorough understanding of what residents expect and need. She knows how to ensure that things run smoothly. But the path to her current role had a major setback when Covid-19 struck. 'I was pregnant with Lilia, so had to shield, and that meant giving up my part-time jobs, both at Abbeyfield and the pharmacy.' Not

only that, but Martin had to put his work on hold during lockdown and was not allowed into the maternity ward when Lilia was born. 'Looking back now, it all seems so crazy,' she reflects. Nevertheless, those months of enforced isolation gave Zoe an even deeper awareness of the social and emotional cost of the isolation that many older people experience.

'It was a former manager who encouraged me to make the move into a management role,' says Zoe. Inevitably, this has involved regular training courses in all aspects of her role and to keep on top of all relevant and new regulations, not least throughout the refurbishment programme. 'But I can see the progress we've made, and the house looks beautiful. The main thing is seeing how happy the residents are—they have enjoyed the transformation. And all the staff have stayed on, which has helped.'

As well as the fresh, modern—and very comfortable—furniture and furnishings in the residents' lounge, there is some delightful artwork, chosen mainly by Zoe. 'I wanted to reflect our rural setting,' she explains. There are paintings and prints of hares and flowers, for example, and a colourful, framed cross stitch peacock, lovingly embroidered by

resident, Mary.

When Exmoor News visited Abbeyfield this autumn, we were delighted to catch up with another familiar Dulverton face, that of Chris Nelder. Chris has given many years of public service to the town; now in his nineties, he still chairs Dulverton Heritage Centre and sings with Voices of Exmoor. Chris had just moved into Abbeyfield House and, although he had found the upheaval of leaving his flat in Northmoor Road challenging, he has settled in very happily. 'To be honest,' he confided, 'I hadn't really thought about it until Zoe mentioned that there was a vacancy at Abbeyfield and I realised that the opportunity might not arise again.' He particularly appreciated the kindness of the staff and the fact that Suzanne Carey, who had previously worked at the Nelder family's local bakery, was one of the Abbeyfield's excellent cooks. (Abbeyfield House has always enjoyed an enviable a reputation for its food!)

Our visit would not have been complete without a guided tour with general assistant, Rachael Gliddon. Rachael joined the permanent staff in 2023 but, in her former career as a hairdresser, had been coming to Abbeyfield House for 10 years. She also has

strong Dulverton connections, going back through the generations; her grandparents owned the town's former shoe shop and some of her grandfather's tools are on display in the Heritage Centre...

Rachael's' commitment to Abbeyfield House shines through; the spacious, light and airy en-suite, bedsitting rooms are spotless, as are the residents' kitchens, where they make their own breakfasts, the reception area, residents' lounge and dining room and the main kitchen, where two hot meals are -prepared and served daily. There is also a guest room, available for visitors' overnight stays, or for respite care for someone recovering from surgery, for example.

'While this is not a care home, as such,' says Rachael, 'caring for our residents and helping when needed is what we are about.' That care can range from helping to unscrew a stubborn bottle top to organising events

such as the Christmas carol concert, when local children sang for residents from the first-floor minstrels' gallery.

The value of the work carried out by people like Rachael is often overlooked and undervalued in the wider world. 'But our residents appreciate what we do and that's what matters. Their families see the value of what we do too. I feel very proud to work here.'





#### Dulverton author's testament to love and determination

Each year, over 7,000 people in the UK are diagnosed with multiple sclerosis; most people are in their thirties or forties. In the 1990s, Roger Hammond's beloved wife, Lyn, became one of those people. For Roger, it meant taking on the role of carer, as well as husband. After Lyn died in 2022, Dulverton resident, Roger, channelled his grief into writing *Lyn and Me*, a memoir dedicated to his late wife, and a tribute to their 43 years of married life and enduring love for each other.

Gradually, the memoir took on additional layers: a detailed look at the condition itself and its progression, and a guide to dealing with the many challenges that confront people with MS and their carers. These range from navigating the complexities of the benefits system, to simple tools and adjustments that make everyday tasks easier. Roger also sets out the invaluable help available nationally, locally and online from the MS Society.

Over the years, Lyn and Roger, who relocated to Dulverton from Harrow in 2010, ran the gamut of emotions but, despite Lyn's diagnosis, they shared a rich and fulfilling life as a couple, as parents and as grandparents. While there are sections that are deeply moving, there is humour too, and an extended chapter on Lyn and Roger's many holidays, at home and abroad, with helpful advice on what to expect and what is available for the mobility impaired traveller.

Published by *Exmoor News, Lyn and Me* is a rare combination: a book that is powerful, profound—and practical; Roger is donating 50 per cent of the profits from its sales to the MS Society, to go towards research and to help people with MS.



#### **Dulverton Development Forum**

Dulverton Development Forum is pleased to be one of the sponsors of this year's Dulverton Literary Festival. But what is this organisation? Aimed at improving the social and economic wellbeing of the town, it was formed around 1986, after the vicar at All Saints' Church, the Reverend Richard Brown, had attended a one-day course—Developing Your Community, organised by Bristol University Extra-Mural Department. He was so impressed that he persuaded me to contact the lecturer, Bernard Lane, to see if a course would be possible in Dulverton.

I had just become Community Education Manager for Southern Exmoor, based at Dulverton Middle School. Bernard came to the school, once a month on Saturday afternoons. After just a few residents attended the first session, news spread, and we were soon up to at least 20 local people who cared for the future of our community. We realised that Dulverton needed to be more proactive, especially in the tourism industry, if we wished to keep our local hotels, B&Bs, pubs, shops and businesses.

Many other towns and villages were promoting themselves in the tourism industry and, just because Dulverton had been a tourism destination for at least a century, we knew we could not expect this to continue by doing nothing. We realised that some sort of tourism brochure was needed. We divided into groups to organise the wording, visuals and advertisers, and printed 70,000 brochures, which were distributed via Tourist Information Centres and ourselves. We continued to do this for many years.

We also felt that Dulverton needed a wet weather attraction. Visitors walking around the town, going down to see the Barle and up to All Saints' Church, would then ask what else was there to do? The idea of a heritage centre was considered. This could also ensure that old photos and other information from the past could be preserved and not risk being destroyed.

Bernard organised visits to various other towns across the country, to see examples of good practice. But where could we site a centre? We became aware that Mr German was planning to sell Dulverton Ironmongers and the old cottages at the back of the store could be for sale as a separate entity.

We raised funds for a feasibility study by a Bristol-based architect and we agreed that this could just be what Dulverton needed. We formed the Dulverton District Civic Society to undertake the project; most of the forum members then became trustees of that charity and worked hard to bring the Dulverton Heritage Centre project to fruition.

Later, local people were concerned that decisions affecting the town were being taken by local councils and authorities without any community consultation. The current Guildhall Car Park was then an area of wasteland, but West Somerset Council had decided that it should be used for building craft shops, with accommodation above. At that time, parking had become very problematic, with lorries delivering goods to local shops in Fore Street daily blocking the road. More car parking was needed and a back entrance to what is now the Coop. Keith Ross and Steven Pugsley were forum members

and decided to stand as councillors at the next election. Consequently, at his first committee meeting, Keith persuaded the council not to pursue their plan and, eventually, the car park was built.

The forum thought it would be useful to find out how other small towns based in National Parks or Areas of Outstanding Beauty managed to work with the authorities to support new and emerging needs of people living there. The Dulverton and District Twinning Association was formed, and we created a fourway link between towns in Poland, France and the Basque country in Spain.

Meanwhile, we become the promoter of Take Art, offering quality theatre, music and dance events, and booking annual visits by Bristol Old Vic Theatre School. With funding from Dulverton Town Council, Somerset West and Taunton Council, and the European Union, we also printed the book *Dulverton Bounds*, with 12 walks around Dulverton.

We hope readers agree that, over 40 years, we have managed to fulfil various differing needs of our special community.





# **The Therapist Collection Reflections from our Clinic**

### Herbal Journeys: Lis Jorgensen, Medical Herbalist

This week, with the onset of autumn, I have been reflecting on the value of commitment in the journey to health. My work as a herbalist enables me to give time to clients. To listen, explore together, all the layers and factors of their experience. This brings insight on both sides, allowing me to prescribe appropriate herbs but also helping individual clients to understand and help themselves.

I have recently heard from the family of a young person we treated for two years. Often, people do not have the patience to keep working and supporting such an endeavour. The modern expectation of quick fixes pervades, but this family persevered to support a neurodivergent child, struggling to balance their energy, immunity and education after Covid.

Treatment was focused on scaffolding resilience by supporting the nervous, immune and digestive systems, also the family unit. This allowed the patient time to grow and heal within a consistent and caring structure. I was happy to hear recently that the young person had passed their GCSEs this summer and is settling into college, finding ways to blossom

Holding space, reflecting, helping to make sense of the whirlwind...I find this work a privilege and I take my hat off to all those going above and beyond to support their loved ones. **Julia Walder: Perinatal and Holistic Therapies** 

Five years ago, Willow Grace started as a little area, just me in our spare bedroom, hoping to create a safe space where women could come and feel supported and cared for. From those first quiet beginnings, Willow Grace has grown step by step, shaped by the amazing women and families who have trusted me with their stories. Each appointment, each conversation, each shared moment has added to the heart of what we do and given me the resilience to carry on.

Now, five years on, I have opened the doors to a brand new space, affectionately nicknamed The Empire, as it feels that this is what I have conquered. It feels like such a milestone, not just because of the space itself, but because of what it represents: community, resilience and the power of women supporting women. I believe there is nothing stronger than women supporting women.

When you walk through the doors, my hope is that you feel the same warmth and care that was there in that very first room at home. A place to rest, to heal, to connect and to know you are not alone.

# Keeping our children safe

You might have been surprised by an age check when you logged on to your favourite social media page this month. That is because the government has implemented tough new rules as part of the Online Safety Act—and they are already changing the way some platforms operate.

If you're a parent or a person with responsibilities for children and young people, you will share my determination that children have a right to a childhood that is not marred

by seeing things that can harm them, online.

For some, the new safeguards may feel trivial or irritating and not worth changing your online experience. But online safety and age-appropriate content *is* a real problem, and far more common than you might think. Research by the Children's Commissioner found that most children have seen pornography by the age of 13. From accidentally clicking on the wrong search result, to a child in the playground pressuring a friend to watch something they should not, harmful content is out there and far too easy to stumble upon.

Some people have voiced concerns that these changes affect their freedoms



but we cannot allow freedom to be used as a shield for tech companies to avoid their responsibilities. This is about protecting the most vulnerable. It is about giving children the space to grow up without being exposed to things that they are not meant to see.

I am glad the UK is leading the way on this. It is now time for every platform to step up, and for us to hold them to account if they fail to.

The introduction of the Online Safety Act puts the responsibility for protecting children squarely where it belongs: on the companies who run these platforms and who profit from them.

Ofcom, the regulator, will be monitoring compliance closely and has made it clear that if platforms do not follow the rules, there will be consequences. These could include fines up to £18 million and potential criminal liability for directors.

The government changes are an important step forward. I welcome them and I am sure many of you do too. Children should be safe. Safe at home. Safe at school. Safe online.

# No condemnation for reborn chapel

A historic Dulverton landmark is enjoying a new lease of life after years of uncertainty.

DulvertonCongregationalChurch—known locally as 'the chapel'-was closed for several years, even rumoured to be condemned. But, this year, members and supporters rallied to secure its future and breathe fresh purpose into the 1831 building.

The chapel is closely linked with Victorian philanthropist, Sir George Williams, founder of the YMCA, who was born in Dulverton. Determined to preserve its heritage and mission, members have teamed up with a new leadership group to reopen the church and plan for its future.

Restoration work continues in the coming months, with local

craftspeople repairing and repainting in original colours. Exmoor National Park Authority's granted permission to replace windows and much of the original Victorian glass will be reused. Professional inspections showed that the main hall's floor had been replaced with new timber and damp-proofing, allaying fears about its condition.

Monthly services have resumed. In October, the Reverend Caroline Stott, president of the Congregational Federation, inspected progress and lead a rededication service. The next service, on 16 November, coincides with the Dulverton Exmoor Literary Festival, when new secretary, Jonathan Hunt, gives a talk entitled George Williams and Dulverton–According to His Biographers.


Deacon David Perry said: 'We want to tell the story of this historic building, George Williams, and the Nonconformists who shaped modern Britain. Our ideas are still developing but are attracting great interest.'

'There is still much to do,' added Jonathan Hunt, 'but the first step was to ensure that we have a living church community, serving Dulverton and Jesus Christ, as it has for nearly 200 years. This would have been possible without our volunteers.'

From fears of closure to signs of revival, the chapel is again central to Dulverton's heritage and community.

# Your rights when events are cancelled

Events are staged throughout the year, but Christmas is a particularly busy time. When you book tickets, keep an eye on the organiser's website and social media profiles for the latest updates. You won't be entitled to a refund if you change your mind about going or realise you can't go anymore, but if an event is cancelled, your refund rights will depend on how you bought the ticket.

If you bought your ticket from an official seller and the organiser cancels, moves, or reschedules the event, you should get a refund. The official seller is the best point of contact to ask about how to get your money back.

If you are having no luck getting a refund, check to see if the seller is a member of the Society of Ticket Agents and Retailers (STAR): www. star.org.uk. If they are, you can use STAR's complaints procedure and dispute resolution service: www. star.org.uk/dispute-resolution. STAR members should provide a refund at face value if the event is cancelled.

and the organiser has agreed to refunds.

You will probably get only the face value of the ticket back–the amount printed on it. If you had to pay any booking or card fees, you might not get those refunded.

If the official seller is not a member of STAR, you may be able to get your money back through your card company or bank. If you bought your ticket from a ticket-reselling website, refunds depend on the site's terms and conditions. If you bought from a private seller and the event is cancelled or rescheduled, it is unlikely that you'll be able to recover your money, but we still recommend contacting the seller.

Be aware of scams. In these situations, scammers can prey on those who have been affected, so if your event is cancelled and people or companies get in touch offering to recover the money on your behalf, be alert to the possibility that it may be a scam.



# **WiveyPool Pool House update**

This summer's fundraising event, *The 1927 Swim Challenge*, was a resounding success and congratulations go to everyone who took part! Together, swimmers completed an incredible 105,960 lengths – the equivalent of 2,906 km (1,806 miles). That's the same distance as driving from WiveyPool to Kyiv, Ukraine – fittingly, the home country of some of our swimmers.

The challenge raised nearly £6,000 in sponsorship and donations, all of which will go towards our muchanticipated Pool House project. While fundraising was the main goal, many swimmers also embraced the personal challenge.

The new Pool House carries a total cost of £250,000. Through budgeting, grant funding and thanks to the incredible generosity of our community, we have already secured £234,500. Although we're not quite at the finish

line, we remain optimistic: several grant applications are still pending, and our Crowdfunder platform remains open for anyone who wishes to contribute.

The final Pool House design will not include a roof terrace or sails as originally envisioned, but instead will benefit from energy efficient solar panels on the roof. This change allows for a more spacious ground floor, which we look forward to putting to excellent use year-round.

Construction will commence mid October, so we will unfortunately be closed for six months. All being well, we are excited to welcome swimmers back for morning lanes in April 2026 to the refreshed and upgraded WiveyPool.

We are hugely grateful to everyone who has supported us so far – your efforts are bringing the Pool House dream alive.


